# SECTION 1 ADMINISTRATIVE OVERVIEW

# 1.1 INTRODUCTION

This is a Call for Offers (CFO) issued by the University of Hawai'i to solicit offers from qualified food service providers to operate Student Affairs food service operations on a concession basis at the Campus Center Complex and Student Housing under the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Students, University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, Honolulu, Hawai'i. In order to be considered, vendors are asked to submit information regarding their expertise and experience and to submit Offers demonstrating their capabilities to effectively operate a successful food service program.

The selected OFFEROR will be the one possessing the requisite experience, expertise and financial resources, that submits a viable offer for managing and operating food services in the most cost effective method taking into account operational expenses, cash handling, inventory purchasing and control, human resource management, board, retail and catering operations, facilities and equipment asset management, advertising and marketing, and support for educational programming based on the objectives and parameters set forth in this CFO. The UNIVERSITY is seeking a vendor that is expertly focused on building an innovative, dynamic, and customer driven dining services program, while being realistically mindful of the resource limitations and constraints with which the UNIVERSITY can develop a long-term contract.

The Vice Chancellor for Student's designee shall be the Contract Administrator with responsibility for ensuring that the selected OFFEROR meets and complies with all requirements of the CONTRACT.

#### 1.2 AUTHORITY

This CFO is issued under the provisions of the Hawai`i Revised Statutes, Section 304A-105(c). All prospective OFFERORS are charged with presumptive knowledge of all requirements of the cited authorities. Submission of a valid executed offer by any prospective OFFEROR shall constitute admission of such knowledge on the part of such prospective OFFEROR.

# 1.3 <u>CFO ORGANIZATION</u>

This CFO is organized into the following sections:

Section 1 - <u>Administrative Overview</u>: Provides OFFERORS with general information on the objectives of this CFO, concession schedule, and concession overview.

Section 2 - <u>Scope of Work</u>: Provides OFFERORS with a general description of the concession rights being provided and delineates UNIVERSITY and OFFEROR responsibilities.

Section 3 - Offer Requirements: Describes the required format and content for the OFFEROR'S Offer.

Section 4 - <u>Criteria to Evaluate Offers</u>: Describes how Offers will be evaluated by the UNIVERSITY.

Section 5 - <u>Special Provisions</u>: Provides OFFERORS the terms and conditions under which the concessions will be operated.

  - 3) The Offer has any provision reserving the right to accept or reject award, or to enter into an agreement pursuant to an award, or provisions contrary to those required in the CFO.

# SECTION 2 SCOPE OF WORK

# 2.1 <u>PURPOSE</u>

The purpose of this Call for Offers (CFO) is to enter into an agreement with a CONTRACTOR to operate Student Affairs Residential Dining, Retail Dining, and Catering Concessions at the facilities designated in Attachment D, including, but not limited to, board/meal plans for on-campus student housing; retail operations in the Campus Center Complex and other food service and catering in Student Affairs facilities in accordance with such policies that may be promulgated by the University of Hawai'i, rules and regulations of the Department of Health, State of Hawai'i, County of Hawai'i Uniform Fire Code and other codes and ordinances for the proper operation and maintenance of the food service facilities.

The UNIVERSITY expects the CONTRACTOR to provide service which emphasizes nutrition, sustainability practices, and cost reasonableness for the UHM campus, in accordance with such policies as may be promulgated by the University of Hawai`i, rules and regulations of the Department of Health, State of Hawai`i, City and County of Honolulu Uniform Fire Code and any other codes and ordinances for the proper operation and maintenance of the food service facilities.

The CONTRACTOR shall be experienced and financially viable with an established record of providing high quality, innovative dining services, preferably in a higher education setting.

#### 2.2 BACKGROUND

The University of Hawai'i at Mānoa (UHM) is the flagship campus of the University of Hawai'i System, the State's sole public university. The UNIVERSITY offers a comprehensive array of undergraduate, graduate, and professional degrees through the doctoral level, carries out advanced research and extends services to the community. Located in Mānoa valley on the island of Oahu, the UNIVERSITY was founded in 1907. Nearly 18,000 students are enrolled at UHM. The UNIVERSITY offers 99 bachelor's degrees, 85 master's degrees, 59 professional and doctoral degrees.

Key stakeholders to the Mānoa Dining Services program include, but are not limited to, the Office of Student Life and Development for retail dining and catering in the Campus Center Complex, the Office of Student Housing Services for residence hall dining, and the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Students.

The UNIVERSITY is seeking an experienced food service company to operate the Mānoa Dining Services program. The following is the core mission of the dining program:

A. Enhance the quality of current menu offerings (see www.uhmdining.com) to provide the highest possible quality of product and service to all market segments while maintaining costs at a reasonable level;

- B. Improve current levels of service to the campus through the establishment of operating hours which are responsive to the needs of students, faculty, staff, and guests;
- C. Provide friendly, responsive, efficient, customer service to all customers while recognizing that students are the primary customer;
- D. Implement measures to effectively control operational costs. The CONTRACTOR shall specifically address labor, food, utility, facilities, and equipment costs to ensure that the Mānoa Dining Services program is a viable self-sustaining operation;
- E. Implement innovative and vibrant marketing strategies, including marketing the Mānoa Dining Services program as an entity;
- F. Improve financial controls and reporting systems in facility and equipment asset management to meet the needs and expectations of the UNIVERSITY; and
- G. Develop and implement short and long term strategies to improve and maintain food service facilities and equipment (front and back of the house), ensuring that facilities are well maintained;
- H. Provide a flexible, creative and affordable catering program that meets the campus needs;
- I. Foster nutrition education and healthy dining program offerings:
- J. Promote sustainable products and programs; and
- K. Identify, develop, and financially support existing and additional dining venues and concepts identified by the Mānoa Dining Services Food Service Committee.

#### 2.3 DEFINITIONS

- A. Board Meal Plan Operations The management and operation of all facets of meal plans for boarders in the UNIVERSITY'S dining program, to include both mandatory and voluntary participants.
- B. Campus Center Complex The facilities of the Campus Center Complex include the Campus Center, Hemenway Hall and the Warrior Recreation Center buildings. The Campus Center Complex is the student union for the Mānoa campus and operates the Campus Center and Student Recreation programs. Programming by the Campus Center Board may be conducted in locations outside of the Campus Center Complex buildings. The Campus Center Complex is governed by the Campus Center Board which is a student organization chartered by the University of Hawai`i Board of Regents. Food service retail operations at the Campus Center Complex are located in the Campus Center and Hemenway Hall buildings. The Office of Student Life and Development provides administrative support for the Campus Center Complex.

- C. Catering The self-sustaining program includes, but is not limited to, the contracting, billing, receipt, and reconciling of payments and deposits for special events requiring the serving of food in facilities covered by this CFO, staffing for banquet captain(s), servers, wait services, clean-up, and presentation/display of food menu items, at each event.
- D. Call For Offers (CFO) The Mānoa Dining Services' solicitation for OFFERS to operate Student Affairs Residential Dining, Retail Dining, and Catering Concessions in designated Student Life and Development and Student Housing Services facilities.
- E. Contract The legally binding agreement entered into between the successful Offeror in this solicitation and the University of Hawai'i, which terms shall include the specifications, terms and conditions, amendments, if any, of this Call for Offer (CFO).
- F. Contract Administrator The individual designated by the Vice Chancellor for Students to be responsible for monitoring the CONTRACTOR in fulfilling its duties and responsibilities under the CONTRACT.
- G. CONTRACTOR The person or the Organization with whom the UNIVERSITY has contracted for the granting of concession rights pursuant to this CONTRACT.
- H. Food Service Operations Include all Student Affairs operations involving the purchase, preparation, and resale of food and other retail items, exclusive of beverage vending and snack machines, unless specifically provided for in sections of this CFO.
- I. Issuing Office The Office of Procurement and Real Property Management (OPRPM) of the University of Hawai`i is the issuing office for this CFO.
- J. Mānoa Dining Services The Student Affairs food service program name used for the marketing and branding of the food service operations that fall under this CFO. The program includes all dining operations within Student Affairs facilities and it is administered by the Student Affairs Dining Group.
- K. New Products Any new product (by name, size, packaging, SKU, initial offering, acquisition, etc.) offered by the CONTRACTOR.
- L. Offer The OFFEROR'S response to the CFO, which may also be referred to as the proposal.
- M. Offeror Any individual or firm responding to this CFO. The successful OFFEROR shall become the CONTRACTOR upon entering into a CONTRACT with the University of Hawai'i. Statements referring to or using the term "OFFEROR" generally indicate requirements, which must be included in the Offer. Statements referring to "CONTRACTOR" generally indicate requirements that will become contractual obligations.
- N. Office of the Vice Chancellor for Students The administrative unit that represents the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa in the administration of all food service contracts of the Mānoa Dining Services program. Facilities under the

Office of the Vice Chancellor for Students include student life, student services, and student housing facilities.

- O. Residential Dining The Mānoa Dining Services program locations for housing residents in a cafeteria style format. Does not include the retail dining locations.
- P. Retail Dining The Mānoa Dining Services program locations for food and other retail items sales outlets through the various formats and branded concepts. Does not include the residential dining cafeterias.
- Q. Student Affairs Dining Group The term used for the assigned Student Affairs food service representatives, including, but not limited to, the Office of Student Life and Development; the Office of Student Housing Services; and the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Students. The group regularly meets with the CONTRACTOR to provide strategic decision making and approvals for the program. The term may be used to represent the UNIVERSITY'S interest.

#### 2.4 SCOPE OF WORK

#### A. Statement of Needs

The objective of the UNIVERSITY'S Residential Dining, Retail Dining, and Catering Concessions Program is to satisfy the nutritional needs of the University community through innovative and high-quality products and services while supporting the UNIVERSITY'S sustainability mission. To this end, the program focuses on the quality of menus, the manner of service, sustainable practices, the economy of prices and merchandising that provides the customer with dining options that are attractive, enjoyable, interesting, and nutritious. In addition, the program includes an educational element to personalize the environment and inform the consumer of food choices that enhance wellness as well as encourage responsible nutritional choices. Further, the program necessitates the continual improvement, maintenance and replacement of the UNIVERSITY'S food service facilities and equipment. The UNIVERSITY'S Residential Dining, Retail Operation and Catering Concessions Program requires a reasonable financial return to the UNIVERSITY. The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for all product purchasing and inventory controls, equipment replacement, and facility upkeep.

#### B. Current Residential Dining Operations

The current Student Housing dining locations are traditional board operations; offering unlimited seconds during each meal in an "all you care to eat" format. The TWO (2) locations serve NINE (9) residence halls and TWO (2) apartment complexes that together accommodate a total of 3,664 residents. Due to potential renovations or unanticipated building closures and changes in occupancy, the precise number of residents will fluctuate throughout the life of this Contract. Managed by the Office of Student Housing Services, TWO (2) dining operations are available for the residents. Hale Aloha Café dining operation has a seating capacity of 450 and includes an "all you care to eat" dining format facility with platform style dining. These platforms are pizza, grill deli, international, classics, soup & salad, desserts, and beverages. The

Gateway Café dining operation has a platform style dining similar to the Hale Aloha Café dining operation with a seating capacity of 400. Students residing in the residence halls are required to be on a meal plan. The current resident maximum population is:

- 1) Hale Aloha (1084 residents in 4 towers, 40 paraprofessionals, and 4 professionals)
- 2) Frear Hall (733 residents, 22 paraprofessionals, and 28 conference beds)
- 3) Gateway House (212 residents, 6 paraprofessional)
- 4) Hale Anuenue (41 residents, 2 paraprofessionals and 1 professional)
- 5) Hale Kahawai (158 residents and 6 paraprofessionals, and 1 professional)
- 6) Hale Laulima (162 residents and 3 paraprofessionals)
- 7) Johnson Hall (186 residents, 5 paraprofessionals, and 1 professional)

Students residing in the apartments have the option to purchase a meal plan. The apartments are:

- 1) Hale Noelani (500 residents, 10 paraprofessionals and 1 professional)
- 2) Hale Wainani (588 residents, 12 paraprofessionals and 2 professionals)

There is an average of 624 apartment residents on a meal plan, of which 244 residents are on the Apartment Club Plan. In FY 2019, Hale Noelani will be closed for renovations. In FY 2020, Hale Wainani will be closed for renovations.

There are currently FIVE (5) meal plans with combinations of meals served, and retail points (See **Attachment A**). Meal plans include varying combinations of number of meals that must be eaten at either the Hale Aloha Café or Gateway café dining operations, and meal plan points that may be used at designated campus retail options. The use of meal swipes at the Hale Aloha Café or Gateway Café allows meal plan holders to partake in an "all you care to eat" meal. Hale Aloha Café and Gateway Café dining operations also accept cash and debit/credit card paying individuals that are not part of the meal plan system.

Meal Plans (Mandatory or Voluntary) – Allow students to use a total number of meals per week during the semester plus a predetermined amount of retail points per semester. Meal plans allow for the "all you care to eat" service in the residence hall dining facilities. Students can use meal swipes at Mānoa Dining Services retail units for a cash equivalency (currently at \$5.50 per meal swipe). Meal plans reset weekly. The number of meal swipes that reset will depend on the meal plan option purchased. Current hours of operation for the residential dining operations are contained in **Attachment B**.

<u>Apartment Club Plans (Voluntary)</u> – Contain FIFTY (50) meal swipes and \$75 in retail points. Meal swipes and retail points can be used the same way as the Meal plans but do not reset on a weekly basis.

<u>Student Housing Services Activities and Events</u> – The current contractor provides dining services at Student Housing for special activities and events such as:

- 1) Conference groups approved by the UNIVERSITY
- 2) Meals for early resident arrivals
- 3) Catered functions approved by the UNIVERSITY
- 4) Special functions when requested by the UNIVERSITY
- 5) Weekly special meals which are limited and not "all you care to eat"
- 6) Ethnic/cultural food nights

# C. <u>Proposed Residential Dining Operations</u>

OFFERORS are invited to propose a Residential dining operation to be implemented for the fall semester 2019. Offers should comply with the following guidelines:

<u>Meal Plans</u> – Meal plans offered should be a mix of traditional declining balance meal swipes and declining balance meal plan points. The UNIVERSITY would like to see FOUR (4) to FIVE (5) plans with different ranges in meal swipes and meal plan points.

Meal Plans will be mandatory for all students living in the residence halls and optional for apartment residents and commuter students. Meal Plans should be developed for fall, spring (inclusive of spring break) and summer housing contract dates.

Meal swipes will be used at Hale Aloha Café, Gateway Café, and all retail dining locations at Student Affairs facilities. Meal swipes at Hale Aloha Café and Gateway Café will be "all you care to eat." At retail dining locations all meal swipes will have the same established equivalency rate per swipe (currently at \$5.50 per meal swipe).

Meal swipes will be reset at the end of each week with the exception of the Apartment Club Plan, which has a set amount of meals swipes for an entire semester. New meal plan assignments begin at the start of each semester. Unused meal plan points will transfer from the fall semester to the spring semester during an academic year; and expire at the end of the academic year. Dining Dollars, Bonus Dining Dollars, and Campus Cash are declining balance stored value accounts similar to meal plan points; however their balances do not expire until after TWO (2) years of account inactivity.

The final structure and pricing of the meal plan program shall be mutually agreed upon by the CONTRACTOR and the Student Affairs Dining Group. Proposed pricing of Meal Plans shall not increase dramatically from year to year. All price increases must also be presented with adequate justification for requested increases to the Chartered Student Organizations (CSO's); which includes the

Campus Center Board (CCB), Resident Housing Association (RHA), the Associated Students of the University of Hawai`i at Mānoa (ASUH), and the Graduate Student Organization (GSO).

<u>Takeout Meal Option</u> – OFFERORS are encouraged to propose a takeout meal alternative for each residential dining location. The final takeout plan shall be mutually agreed upon by the Student Affairs Dining Group and the CONTRACTOR.

<u>Guest Meal Swipes</u> – OFFERORS shall propose a plan to allow students the ability to bring guest(s) into all dining locations and use meal swipe(s) for their guest(s). The final guest meals plan shall be mutually agreed upon by the Student Affairs Dining Group and the CONTRACTOR.

Meal Plan Special Accommodation Policy – Student Housing recognizes that some residents may require special menu accommodation due to medically supported health issues. The CONTRACTOR will have a registered dietician on staff who will work with these students and their medical doctors to provide meal options that provide nutritious food for residents with special health needs, at a comparable value. In the event that the CONTRACTOR cannot provide appropriate meal accommodations, the CONTRACTOR shall collaborate with Student Housing to determine the next best option, which may include an exemption from the meal program.

<u>Staff Meal Plans</u> – Offerors shall propose a TEN (10) per week meal plan option for live-in student (Resident Advisors) and professional staff. Live-in professional meal plans will be a meal swipes-only plan and may only be used at the residential dining facilities. Meal service during training will be negotiated with Student Housing Services, who will only be responsible for paying for the meal swipes used. The cost of staff meal plans shall be mutually agreed upon by the CONTRACTOR and the Student Affairs Dining Group.

<u>Hours of Operations</u> – Offerors shall propose a plan with flexible dining hours of operation for residential dining operations that includes Gateway Café and Hale Aloha Café dining operations, The Market and a late night dining operation. Initial hours of operations and all subsequent adjustments shall be mutually agreed upon by the CONTRACTOR and the Student Affairs Dining Group. The CONTRACTOR shall not establish nor change food service hours, meal plans, menus, food options offered or methods of operations without consultation and a written approval by the Student Affairs Dining Group.

<u>Gateway Café and Hale Aloha Café Dining Operations</u> – Offerors shall submit a detailed Offer for the operation of Hale Aloha Café and Gateway Café dining operations:

The Offer should include the number and types of concepts/ stations available for breakfast, lunch, dinner and brunch (weekend only).

A FIVE (5) week menu cycle shall be utilized. All menus shall be prepared and submitted THREE (3) weeks in advance for the Student Affairs Dining Group approval.

Vegan and/or vegetarian options shall be available at all meals.

Offerors shall include a plan for an "allergy free zone" that meets specific dietary restrictions.

The University of Hawai`i at Mānoa is proud of its diverse student and staff population. For this reason the proposed menus shall reflect options that incorporate meeting the needs of a diverse population including international students.

Minimum food specifications are described in Concession Responsibilities in Section 2.7 L, M, and N. Offerors are encouraged to propose food specifications that exceed these minimums and offer more creative menu cycles.

The CONTRACTOR shall have adequate supplies of all standard menu offerings at all times to ensure patrons will be able to partake in "all you care to eat."

Offerors will prepare all food on the premises on the day it is served. Food for all Mānoa Dining Services programs will be cooked fresh during the serving period. Advanced preparation and cooking shall be kept at a minimum, so freshness and quality may be maintained.

All food items on the service line shall be individually labeled in an attractive manner so that they may be clearly identified by the customer in all retail and residential locations. Ingredients, calories and possible allergens of food items shall be displayed.

The CONTRACTOR shall operate a level of service for breakfast, lunch and dinner to accommodate students, conference guests, and walk-in patrons. Cash, debit/credit cards, Dining Dollars, Campus Cash, Apple Pay, and Google Pay payments must be accepted

<u>Additional Late Night Option</u> – Offerors are encouraged to propose food service concepts for an afterhours program at new or existing Student Housing facilities which allows residents to use their meal plans to purchase items that include, but are not limited to grab and go, snack type foods, limited drinks, and other Late Night Options in addition to the Market operation. Offers should include menu items, hours of operation, and location.

# D. <u>Current Student Affairs Retail Dining Operations</u>

The current retail locations are a combination of local, national and in-house brands. Hours of operation vary and all accept cash, debit/credit cards, Dining Dollars, Campus Cash, and meal plan equivalency swipes. Locations that do not incur royalty payments currently accept Bonus Dining Dollars, which are issued as an incentive to purchase Dining Dollars.

The retail offerings at the Campus Center Complex are:

- 1) Nationally branded coffee shop
- 2) Nationally branded smoothie shop

- 3) Nationally branded pizza shop
- 4) Grab and Go food store
- 5) Food Court featuring local brands and in-house food concepts
- 6) In-house Asian food concept
- 7) Local branded restaurant and bar

These Campus Center Complex food service operations accept cash, debit/credit cards, Dining Dollars, Campus Cash, Apple Pay, Google Pay and meal plan equivalency swipes. Locations that do not incur royalty payments currently accept Bonus Dining Dollars, which are issued as an incentive to purchase Dining Dollars.

The Mānoa Dining Services program also operates The Market at Noelani, which is a convenience store concept at the Student Housing facilities.

The Mānoa Dining Services program retail operations compete with non-student affairs retail operations on campus. Non-student affairs operations include: Paradise Palms (a food court style facility), concession food services at Athletic facilities, and vendors who operate kiosks and lunch trucks throughout the campus. All of these non-student affairs operated food retailers are managed by another campus department, Auxiliary Services.

A Subway branded sandwich shop is also located in the Campus Center building, but is <u>not</u> part of this CONTRACT.

Current operating hours of the Mānoa Dining Services retail locations are shown in **Attachment C**.

The current contractor also operates food and beverage concessions and/or opens locations when requested to support Student Affairs events.

# E. <u>Proposed Student Affairs Retail Dining Operations</u>

OFFERORS shall submit an OFFER to enhance the current retail operations described above along the following lines:

The CONTRACTOR shall provide a diverse portfolio of national and local branded retail concepts for the Mānoa Dining Services program. In-house retail concepts may also be considered.

All retail operations shall continue to accept cash, debit/credit cards, Dining Dollars, Campus Cash, Apple Pay, Google Pay and meal plan equivalency swipes. The Campus Center Food Court shall have a minimum of FOUR (4) food concepts. Reasonable retail pricing that is competitive with off-campus dining establishments offering similar products shall be maintained. The UNIVERSITY desires appropriate and frequent use of merchandising and marketing techniques and décor alterations in the management of the Campus Center Complex retail operations. The remaining life of branded concepts shall

be assessed continually. The CONTRACTOR shall work together with the Student Affairs Dining Group to ensure that brands no longer popular with students as determined by mutually agreed to assessment methods, are replaced with brands that meet new and current preferences.

The Student Affairs Dining Group reserves the right to request that brands that no longer meet the needs of the campus community be replaced. The CONTRACTOR shall have the resources to provide national brand concepts. The CONTRACTOR shall replace any in-house retail brand that is no longer supported by the CONTRACTOR'S corporate organization with the equivalent inhouse retail brand at no cost to the UNIVERSITY. Replacement shall include, but is not limited to, renovations, new equipment, marketing materials, signage, menus, and employee training. Vegetarian and vegan items will be available in at least one retail operation as mutually agreed upon by the CONTRACTOR and the Student Affairs Dining Group.

The CONTRACTOR shall provide self-operated and/or subcontracted satellite dining concepts (food trucks, food carts, etc.) at the direction of the Student Affairs Dining Group, in order to provide diverse dining options that fulfill program needs and address special event requirements.

The CONTRACTOR shall support Student Affairs activities and initiatives, including but not limited to continuing to provide food and beverage concessions for Student Affairs events when called upon, and implementing services that relate to food insecurities for students on campus.

The OFFER shall include plans to transition the focus of The Market from a convenience store to more of a market operation. Beyond simply providing snacks, The Market should operate as a place for apartment residents to find reasonably priced options to use while cooking in their apartments and for other residents to find items that might reduce the need to leave campus to buy food. New product items unique to the convenience service store must be approved by the Student Affairs Dining Group.

The CONTRACTOR shall work with the Student Affairs Dining Group to develop prices that are competitive with food market prices as opposed to typical convenience store prices.

The CONTRACTOR shall promote sustainable practices with minimized packaging whenever reasonably possible.

The CONTRACTOR must provide a discount program for customers that bring their own mugs for regular coffee.

Additional Specifications for Retail Operations:

#### 1) PRICES AND PORTIONS

Prices shall not exceed the pricing set forth in **Attachment F** from the notice to proceed date to June 30, 2020, provided the Federal and Hawai`i State tax structure and statutory minimum wage requirements remain the

same. However, this does not preclude changes in price downward during this period.

- a) In cases where pricing is not available for a product in Attachment
   F, pricing will be based on CONTRACTOR requested equivalent product. The Student Affairs Dining Group shall be the sole judge of quality and equivalency of requested product changes.
- b) In cases where pricing is not available for a product and there are no equivalent products in **Attachment F**, the Technical Representative and the CONTRACTOR will mutually agree upon a price for the item.
- c) The UNIVERSITY shall approve in writing all proposed retail menu additions not specifically included in the **Attachment F**, including item, portion and price, and the serving schedules.

# 2) RETAIL MENUS

Attention shall be given to the offering of menu selections that accommodate a diverse campus clientele and customer nutritional concerns. There must be a balance of fast food and the more traditional fare such as salads, soups, deli sandwiches, and hot entrees.

### 3) RETAIL HOURS

The CONTRACTOR shall utilize current hours of service as a guide for the first year as outlined in **Attachment C**. The UNIVERSITY will approve in writing the CONTRACTOR'S proposed hours of service during subsequent years, for the duration of the CONTRACT term. Such hours must be maintained for FOUR (4) months prior to the CONTRACTOR making a request to revise the hours of operation or as otherwise approved by the UNIVERSITY.

If the UNIVERSITY and the CONTRACTOR fail to mutually agree on operational hours, the hours stated in **Attachment C** shall be used as the standard minimum hours of operation.

Nothing in this CONTRACT prevents the CONTRACTOR from keeping open longer than the normal hours of operation provided that it is in the best interest of the UNIVERSITY and approved by the UNIVERSITY.

#### F. Summer Board and Conference Requirements

The UNIVERSITY will implement a summer board contract program if residential occupancy warrants such a service or if the summer conference schedule is consistent enough to provide a regular service.

Annually, upon request, the CONTRACTOR shall provide proposed rates for summer camps/conferences to the UNIVERSITY by September 15th for the ensuing year. If requested by the UNIVERSITY, periodic meetings shall be held throughout the year to determine the pricing format, services desired, conference schedules, numbers, dates, desired feeding locations, and any other pertinent information.

Menus shall be varied to suit the clientele (such as youth or high school athletic camps, adult groups), but the meals shall be provided with services, food preparations, and presentation at a level of quality at least equal to that of the regular academic year.

The CONTRACTOR shall honor the specific commitments of summer board and conference menus, prices, and other arrangements made by the incumbent contractor, and known by the UNIVERSITY, for catering service prior to beginning a new Agreement. If the CONTRACTOR is unable to fulfill such requests, similar or higher quality replacement items shall be offered at no additional cost.

#### G. Current Catering Operations

The Mānoa Dining Services program includes catering services for student clubs and organizations, faculty, staff, departmental and administration events, and outside groups. The services range from a no-frills approach and boxed lunches to high-end banquets, as well as coffee service, casual catering, and a pickup service. The majority of all catered events are at UHM Student Affairs facilities at both Student Housing and the Campus Center Complex.

Catering does not currently have exclusive rights to catering at the University of Hawai`i at Mānoa.

# H. Proposed Catering Concessions

- The CONTRACTOR shall provide a catering concession program for UNIVERSITY approved functions such as receptions, banquets, private parties, refreshment service, carryout service, and other special events. The catering program should reflect the diverse needs of students and faculty and staff in its service menu.
- 2) The CONTRACTOR shall provide catered services and menus that are comparable to or better than those currently in effect. Existing policies that determine the scope of the UNIVERSITY-sponsored functions shall determine the catered events included in the terms of the Agreement. It is important that catered functions for these groups be of the highest professional standards featuring quality service and appropriate ambiance.
- This program is being offered as an exclusive catering contract for Student Affairs facilities. Approval for waivers to allow outside catering at UHM Student Affairs facilities will be approved by the Student Affairs Dining Group on a case by case basis, with an emphasis on allowing student

- organizations to have additional affordable food options at Student Affairs facilities.
- 4) Multiple levels of services must be offered to the customer. For instance, table cover arrangements should range from no cover to paper tablecloths to table linens. The same principle applies to china versus paper, and cafeteria service versus sit-down banquet service. Catered service procedures, operational requirements, and menus shall provide at minimum, three types of service formats for catering:
  - a) Pickup service.
  - b) Coffee and/or light refreshment service.
  - c) Event catering service with multiple service levels.
- 5) A proposed catering guide to menus, prices, portions servings, catering policies, minimums, additional charges, etc. shall be submitted to the UNIVERSITY. The catering guides must be reviewed and approved by the UNIVERSITY. Copies of catering guides shall be posted on a website, as well as printed in sufficient number, and distributed between summer and fall terms. The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for cost, production and distribution.
- 6) The CONTRACTOR shall honor the specific commitments of catering menus, prices, and other arrangements made by the incumbent contractor, and known by the UNIVERSITY, for catering service prior to beginning a new Agreement. If the CONTRACTOR is unable to fulfill such requests, similar or higher quality replacement items shall be offered at no additional cost.
- 7) The CONTRACTOR shall bear all cost with the startup of the catering operation including, but not limited to, providing all necessary equipment to run the operation. Equipment shall include, but is not limited to, small ware, warmers, and serving equipment.
- 8) The CONTRACTOR shall meet at least quarterly with the UNIVERSITY to evaluate the catering program and, as necessary, make revisions to improve overall service.
- 9) Catering provided to non-UNIVERSITY groups which come to the campus for meetings, conferences, and events, will be billed by the CONTRACTOR and collection for such events is the sole responsibility of the CONTRACTOR unless some other authorized campus entity is acting as the organizing/sponsoring representative for that group. The CONTRACTOR shall provide to the UNIVERSITY on a quarterly basis, a reporting of non-UNIVERSITY catering events.
- 9) The CONTRACTOR may use the kitchen facilities to cater events off campus provided the following:

- a) The off-campus event catering commission rates shall be the same as the commission rate for on-campus catering functions. All food prepared in the Campus Center dining facilities but sold off-campus shall be considered catered food.
- b) Off-campus events shall not negatively impact the service to the campus.
- 10) The CONTRACTOR shall effectively communicate and coordinate the menu, details of services required, and advice on effective program arrangements with the individual or department requesting catering service.
- 11) The CONTRACTOR shall provide a sufficient number of qualified and trained staff to service the events, take and process catering orders, respond to inquiries, and handle all aspects of a quality catering program.
- 12) The CONTRACTOR shall identify one of its staff members, who has been trained for this type of service, as a catering manager who will be responsible for all aspects of catered events. This person's other duties shall not conflict with these responsibilities.
- 13) The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for control of admissions and collection of tickets for catered events where required by the event sponsor or host.
- 14) The CONTRACTOR shall establish and maintain a regular process for evaluating catering event food and service quality.

#### I. Minimum Acceptable Qualifications/Experience

- OFFERORS shall be national in scope and be currently operating at a minimum of FIVE (5) colleges and universities which have board meal plan operations. Each such account shall have been operating for the past THREE (3) years.
- 2) OFFERORS shall have received over \$75 million in gross sales in nonvending college or university food service operations in its last fiscal year.
- 3) OFFERORS shall be fully acquainted with conditions relating to the scope and restrictions related to the work under this CFO. The failure or omission of an OFFEROR to be acquainted with existing conditions shall in no way provide relief from any obligation with respect to this CFO or any CONTRACT awarded.
- 4) OFFERORS shall demonstrate the ability to provide nationally branded retail concepts.

5) OFFERORS shall have sufficient personnel and resources to provide the UNIVERSITY with the level of professionalism and quality of food and service expected under this CFO.

#### 2.5 SCOPE OF CONCESSION

- A. CONTRACTOR agrees to operate and maintain Residential Dining Concessions for the UNIVERSITY in accordance with such policies as may be promulgated by the University of Hawai`i campus, rules and regulations of the Department of Health, State of Hawai`i, County of Hawai`i Uniform Fire Code and any other codes and ordinances for the proper operation and maintenance of the food service facilities.
- B. CONTRACTOR agrees to operate and maintain Retail Dining Concessions for the UNIVERSITY in accordance with such policies as may be promulgated by the University of Hawai`i campus, rules and regulations of the Department of Health, State of Hawai`i, County of Hawai`i Uniform Fire Code and any other codes and ordinances for the proper operation and maintenance of the food service facilities.
- C. CONTRACTOR agrees to operate and maintain a Catering Concession program out of the Campus Center facility at the UNIVERSITY, in accordance with such policies as may be promulgated by the University of Hawai`i campus, rules and regulations of the Department of Health, State of Hawai`i, County of Hawai`i Uniform Fire Code and any other codes and ordinances for the proper operation and maintenance of food service.

# 2.6 PREMISES

- A. The UNIVERSITY grants to the CONTRACTOR the exclusive right to conduct food service operations at UHM Student Affairs foodservice facilities on a concession basis. Existing foodservice operations outside of the Mānoa Dining Services program such as Subway are exempted. Locations for such operations shall be designated by the UNIVERSITY. Currently designated locations are identified in **Attachment D**. Prior to the award of any contract with an outside vendor, the UNIVERSITY and the CONTRACTOR shall review the terms and conditions of such contract to determine the final impact of the new operation. The UNIVERSITY may modify the commission structure if the new operation significantly financially impacts this Food Service Contract.
- B. The CONTRACTOR agrees to allow UNIVERSITY- approved student sponsored activities to provide their own food for on-campus meetings, events, and other functions provided prior catering waiver approval is obtained from the Student Affairs Dining Group.
- C. The UNIVERSITY may at its discretion construct new food service facilities, discontinue the use of food service premises or require the relocation of food service office, preparation areas, storage facilities to accommodate future expansion of campus facilities or develop, renovate and remodel existing

facilities. The CONTRACTOR shall be notified SIX (6) months in advance, in writing, and agrees to operate additional premises as requested by the UNIVERSITY and shall terminate food service operations at discontinued premises at no expense to the UNIVERSITY.

- D. The UNIVERSITY reserves the right, without interference with normal food services, to use the dining, production and service areas under the CONTRACT for its purposes. Appropriate setup and cleanup charges, as agreed by the UNIVERSITY and CONTRACTOR, may be assessed to the UNIVERSITY, or the UNIVERSITY shall have the right to hire its own personnel to perform such services. The facilities shall be restored to conditions satisfactory to the CONTRACTOR before the next regularly schedule meal service.
- E. This CONTRACT to operate residential and retail dining and catering concessions at the UNIVERSITY is NOT a lease of the locations upon which the food service operations are conducted.
- F. The University of Hawai`i at Mānoa currently has exclusive beverage and snack vending contracts. The CONTRACTOR agrees to abide by these agreements.

# 2.7 CONCESSION RESPONSIBILITIES

CONTRACTOR will provide for the purchase, preparation, sale and services of food and beverages for the residential dining facilities, retail dining facilities, and catering and conferencing. The CONTRACTOR shall at its own expense, obtain all necessary permits, give all necessary notices, pay all license fees, and comply with all laws, rules, ordinances, and regulations applicable to the business carried on under this agreement.

#### A. MANAGEMENT AND PERSONNEL

- The CONTRACTOR will maintain an adequate staff on duty at the UNIVERSITY at all times to ensure a quality dining service operation. In order to maintain a high quality of service, the CONTRACTOR will be responsible for providing expert, experienced, and qualified personnel for administration and supervision, menu planning and dietetics, production, purchasing, service, sanitation, marketing, and equipment consulting. The CONTRACTOR shall submit by June 1st of each year the organization and staffing plan for administration of food service operation covered by the CONTRACT for review by the Student Affairs Dining Group. Changes and additional management hires must include notification to the Student Affairs Dining Group.
- 2) A qualified and responsible supervisor of the CONTRACTOR shall be on duty at all times that food service operations are being conducted.
- 3) The CONTRACTOR will continually provide satisfactory training and development programs for its employees at all levels of the food service

- operation. Regularly scheduled full-time, part-time, and student employee training meetings will be conducted by the CONTRACTOR.
- 4) The CONTRACTOR shall conduct annual food safety audit inspections by a third-party consultant certified in Hazard Analysis Critical Point Control (HACCP). Audits should be un-announced and include detailed evaluation of all locations managed by the CONTACTOR. The audit reports and any needed follow-up corrections must be shared with the UNIVERSITY within THIRTY (30) days of receipt. Any critical audit findings that may require shutdown of an operation must be immediately reported to the UNIVERSITY.
- 5) The CONTRACTOR will have the capability of and be financially responsible for complying with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations regarding the employment, compensation, and payment of personnel. This includes, without limitation, unemployment insurance, worker's compensation, and other taxes, health examinations, permits, and licenses. The CONTRACTOR shall act as an independent CONTRACTOR, and not an agent of the UNIVERSITY, in all aspects of any management and operational duties and responsibilities in its delivery of the CONTRACT.
- 6) The UNIVERSITY will require an Annual Business Plan each year. The Business Plan shall include performance targets mutually established each year, along with measurements to help the UNIVERSITY to determine the viability of any price or service changes.
- 7) The UNIVERSITY will have the right to conduct interviews of proposed candidates for the CONTRACTOR'S General Manager and Site Manager positions and review the CONTRACTOR'S final recommendation before an appointment is made. While the UNIVERSITY reserves the right to review and comment on such appointments, the CONTRACTOR alone will have the right to make such appointments and will be solely responsible for the employment decision. The General Manager will not be changed unless mutually agreed upon in writing between the UNIVERSITY and the CONTRACTOR and THIRTY (30) days advance notice in writing is provided to the UNIVERSITY.
- 8) The CONTRACTOR is responsible for the on-campus behavior of all its employees. The CONTRACTOR'S employees will abide by all the rules and regulations which govern the UNIVERSITY'S employees. Such rules and regulations pertain to, but are not limited to traffic/parking regulations, the consumption of alcohol/use of illegal drugs or being under the influence of either, as well as prohibitions on smoking. Infractions of the rules and regulations may result in the UNIVERSITY requesting that the individual no longer be employed by the CONTRACTOR at the UNIVERSITY.
- 9) The CONTRACTOR shall provide health and tuberculosis examinations for all employees as required by law.

- 10) The CONTRACTOR shall provide all CONTRACT employees with uniforms and name tags that are to be worn at all times while on duty. The CONTRACTOR'S management and administrative staff shall be dressed in business attire with name and title tag displayed.
- 11) The CONTRACTOR shall pay the prevailing parking fees for all CONTRACTOR vehicles parked on campus. The UNIVERSITY reserves the right to determine the number of parking permits to be issued as well as the location of the designated parking areas.
- 12) The CONTRACTOR shall develop a detailed, proactive transition plan for assuming management of the UNIVERSITY Residential and Retail Dining and Catering Concessions programs, and for the successful transition/opening of the UNIVERSITY'S food service concessions operations by August 12, 2019. The transition plan shall be implemented immediately on the effective date of the **Notice to Proceed.**
- 13) In the event of a change in CONTRACTOR, the succeeding CONTRACTOR shall give fair employment, at no less than their existing rate of compensation, to any non-management employees of the current contractor who seek such employment, for at least NINETY (90) calendar days from when the employees commence work, in order to determine their ability to perform. After said NINETY (90) days have expired, there will be no further obligation of the succeeding CONTRACTOR to honor this commitment.
- 14) The CONTRACTOR is encouraged to utilize UNIVERSITY students as part of its workforce wherever feasible and whenever quality can be maintained. Such students shall be hired, trained, paid and supervised by the CONTRACTOR. It is requested that the CONTRACTOR adhere to UNIVERSITY employment practices whenever feasible including wages and adhering to not more than TWENTY (20) hours of work per week for full time students during instructional weeks.
- 15) The CONTRACTOR shall provide corporate management staff, made known to the UNIVERSITY by name, to routinely review and inspect operations, personally fill vacancies, consult with the UNIVERSITY on current and future food service programs and trends, and to act with full authority on the CONTRACTOR'S behalf in any and all matters pertaining to the specifications of the Contract.
- 16) The CONTRACTOR, at its own expense shall provide at a minimum an annual visitation by corporate headquarters management staff to review operations, maintain quality control standards, and consult with the UNIVERSITY on current and future food service programs and industry trends.

# B. <u>EQUIPMENT – INVENTORY, REPLACEMENT AND REPAIRS</u>

- At the commencement of the Contract, the CONTRACTOR shall inventory all food service equipment and shall examine the same in order to determine operational condition of major equipment items. All equipment that requires direct wiring shall be considered major equipment and shall include, but shall not be limited to dishwashers, mixers, stoves, ovens, fryers, steamers, kettles, ventilation hoods, dishwashers, washing machines and dryers, pot washers, steam tables, refrigeration units (including compressors and motors, etc.), choppers, slicers, microwave ovens, disposals and dish belts, steam or hot water boilers, air conditioning equipment installed expressly for the food service operation. The CONTRACTOR shall submit a list of all equipment accepted "as is" and equipment accepted for repair and reconditioning.
- 2) The UNIVERSITY and the CONTRACTOR shall examine all equipment accepted for repair and reconditioning and the work needed to bring each equipment item up to a mutually acceptable operational level. Equipment items mutually determined to be beyond economic repair or obsolete shall be discarded. Ownership of said equipment shall remain with the UNIVERSITY.
- 3) The CONTRACTOR shall maintain equipment and dining facilities in compliance with UNIVERSITY regulations, as well as all State and local health sanitation regulations relating to personnel, maintenance of kitchens, dining rooms, storage rooms, clothing, etc. The CONTRACTOR shall conform to all requirements of the UNIVERSITY'S Environmental Safety Specialist. The CONTRACTOR is required to protect all equipment and dining facilities against loss, pilferage or destruction.
- 4) The CONTRACTOR shall develop and maintain an Equipment Repair and Replacement Schedule for all equipment under this CONTRACT. This list shall be submitted to the Student Affairs Dining Group for review on at least an annual basis. The schedule should include food service equipment repair and replacement planned by location.
- 5) All costs associated with the purchase of new and replacement equipment for the Mānoa Dining Services program shall be the sole responsibility of the CONTRACTOR. The CONTRACTOR shall install all equipment in strict compliance with applicable building, electrical and mechanical regulations, and codes of the UNIVERSITY, State of Hawai'i and County of Hawai'i.
  - Use of any heavy electrical appliances and equipment must be approved in advance by the UNIVERSITY prior to use of the electrical circuit.

- b) The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for the maintenance, repair, and/or replacement of all equipment and appliances for all dining locations.
- c) All equipment shall be maintained in top working condition at all times to protect against electrical and fire hazards, and to avoid food safety and sanitation hazards.
- d) In an effort to save energy, all new equipment shall be energy star rated whenever possible.
- e) Any damage to the assigned space or building which is the result of improper installation or maintenance on the CONTRACTOR'S part will be the CONTRACTOR'S financial responsibility.
- f) The CONTRACTOR shall obtain all necessary permits, give all necessary notices, pay all applicable license fees, and comply with all laws, rules, ordinances, and regulations applicable to the business carried under this agreement.
- 6) The CONTRACTOR shall provide all office supplies and equipment including, but not limited to, telephone installation, maintenance and monthly service cost, postage, printing, photocopier service, etc.
- 7) The CONTRACTOR shall provide all vehicles for servicing the UNIVERSITY Residential Dining, Retail Operation and Catering Concession programs. All vehicles shall be the property of the CONTRACTOR or approved SUBCONTRACTOR, and shall be identified with the Mānoa Dining Services logo. All vehicles shall be maintained in accordance with State of Hawai'i Department of Health standards for transporting food.
- 8) The UNIVERSITY will provide an initial inventory of expendable and nonexpendable supplies and equipment (e.g., china, glassware, flatware, trays and kitchen utensils). The CONTRACTOR, through the life of and term of this Agreement, shall be responsible for the cost of maintaining the supplies and equipment at or above the minimum or par stock levels.
- 9) Prior to the start of the Agreement, the UNIVERSITY and the CONTRACTOR will jointly inspect the inventory of such equipment. The resultant inventory shall serve as the base for the CONTRACT terms and conditions.
- 10) Campus Center and Student Housing will provide office spaces at both locations to the CONTRACTOR at mutually agreed upon monthly rental rates. If accepted, the CONTRACTOR will be responsible for maintenance of such space in good condition and repair. The CONTRACTOR at its own expense will furnish any additional office furniture not included in the current offices.

- 11) The UNIVERSITY agrees to provide and make available for the CONTRACTOR, use of all UNIVERSITY owned furniture, fixtures and equipment associated with the concession facilities. Ownership of said equipment shall remain with the UNIVERSITY. The CONTRACTOR shall be required to keep all furniture, fixtures and equipment in good repair and condition, and protect it against loss, pilferage or destruction.
- 12) With respect to the equipment provided by the UNIVERSITY, the UNIVERSITY makes no implied or express warranties, including, but not limited to, the implied warranties of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose. Unless otherwise specifically agreed, all UNIVERSITY equipment offered for CONTRACTOR'S use will be supplied in "AS IS" condition.
- 13) The CONTRACTOR, at its cost, will provide all new cash registers, plus any office machines necessary for the management of the dining service operation including computers (and software), printers, facsimile machines, copy machines, typewriters, calculators, and other similar items.
- 14) The CONTRACTOR will be responsible for performing the proper use and care for the equipment and facilities it is assigned and/or uses in the performance of its daily duties as specified by the equipment manufacturers. The CONTRACTOR will be responsible for performing first level (operator) preventive maintenance on all equipment, fixtures, furnishings, and building components. The CONTRACTOR shall provide a preventative maintenance schedule for all equipment to the UNIVERSITY.
- 15) The CONTRACTOR will provide, at its own cost, any other equipment not provided by the UNIVERSITY that the CONTRACTOR deems necessary to implement its unique dining concepts. The installation of permanent CONTRACTOR or vendor owned equipment will require the prior written approval of the UNIVERSITY.
- 16) If the CONTRACT is terminated by the UNIVERSITY for convenience, without cause, or expires, the UNIVERSITY shall assess equipment purchased during the CONTRACT by the CONTRACTOR within THIRTY (30) days. The University or new contractor shall have the option to reimburse the CONTRACTOR for any equipment purchased by the CONTRACTOR by paying the remaining unamortized portion of the equipment to the CONTRACTOR within THIRTY (30) days after the assessment. The amortization schedule for equipment purchases shall use generally accepted accounting standards agreed upon by the UNIVERSITY and CONTRACTOR [straight line basis] from the first day of the CONTRACT over a period of FIFTEEN (15). Therefore, the assessment or reimbursement shall be computed by [multiplying the total equipment investment amount by the remaining months of the CONTRACT divided by

- 180 months] taking the equipment investment amount agreed upon less the total amortization allowed.
- 17) At the expiration of the CONTRACT, the UNIVERSITY will conduct a physical inventory of all non-expendable supplies and capital equipment. At that time, the CONTRACTOR will surrender the facilities and non-expendable supplies and equipment to the UNIVERSITY in as good condition as at the start of the Agreement, excepting ordinary wear and tear and loss or damage by fire, flood, and other perils covered by extended coverage insurance. The inventory must be equal to the original inventory plus any additional equipment provided during the life of the Contract.

# C. FOOD AND OTHER SUPPLIES

- 1) The CONTRACTOR will be responsible for all costs (as a part of doing business) for required food, paper, office, janitorial, and chemical supplies for the operation of the dining facilities.
- 2) The CONTRACTOR agrees to keep a sufficient variety and quantity of food in stock at the premises or a purveyor's warehouse to enable the CONTRACTOR to continue the food service concession operations for at least seven (7) days in case of cessation of food deliveries to the State of Hawai'i.
- 3) The CONTRACTOR shall provide for any and all other expenses incurred in food service concession operations, including the costs of air freight in obtaining foodstuffs to enable the CONTRACTOR to continue the food service operations in the event of a shipping and/or dock strike.
- 4) The CONTRACTOR will be responsible for providing and maintaining, at its own cost, an inventory of paper service adequate to meet emergency needs should the dishwashing facilities become inoperative and paper or other disposable service is required.
- 5) Upon expiration or termination of the Agreement, inventories of food and expendable supplies of the CONTRACTOR will remain those of the CONTRACTOR. Final payment to be made to the CONTRACTOR by the UNIVERSITY (transfer of funds from the fee/board account), if any, will be withheld until all transactions or arrangements for the inventory removal or transfer to succeeding contractor have been completed to the satisfaction of the UNIVERSITY.

#### D. UTILITIES

 The UNIVERSITY shall be responsible for providing electricity, gas, steam, water, and sewer service, where applicable, for all Mānoa Dining Services locations. The cost of which to be borne primarily by the UNIVERSITY except:

- a) The CONTRACTOR will be expected to prudently manage the cost of energy use. In the event that the cost of utilities for the fiscal year exceeds the total commissions to the UNIVERSITY under the CONTRACT for the same fiscal year, the charges in excess of the total commissions shall be split evenly between the CONTRACTOR and the UNIVERSITY.
- b) A long-term goal is to have the CONTRACTOR assume responsibility for an appropriate share of other utility costs incurred in the dining operations. This will be incrementally implemented after discussions with the CONTRACTOR, as our current meters do not allow for accurate assessment of the CONTRACTOR'S cost share for these utilities. The utilities the UNIVERSITY shall be responsible for providing shall be negotiated as the utilities become metered.
- 2) The UNIVERSITY does not guarantee an uninterrupted supply of water, steam, electricity, gas, heat, or air conditioning. However, the UNIVERSITY shall be diligent in restoring service following an interruption. The UNIVERSITY will not be liable for any damages or losses attendant thereto, including without limitation, product loss that may result from the interruption or failure of any such utility services, nor any loss of use or lost profit.
- 3) The CONTRACTOR will assume responsibility for maximum utility/energy conservation. The CONTRACTOR will adopt and enforce a policy of turning off or down lights, fans, water, ovens, steam equipment, and other energy consuming items when the Mānoa Dining Services facilities are not in use or when business volume dictates a reduction in the use of utilities.
- 4) The CONTRACTOR will use the UNIVERSITY Telephone System and will pay all monthly phone charges.
- 5) The UNIVERSITY will pay for installation of data-lines when required for services mandated by the UNIVERSITY.

#### E. FACILITIES MAINTENANCE, SANITATION, SAFETY, AND INSPECTIONS

- The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for maintenance of all dining facilities to include the repair and maintenance of interior doors, kitchen areas, dining areas, water heaters, hoods, serving areas, and air conditioning units.
  - Air conditioning that is dedicated to dining locations only will be the responsibility of the CONTRACTOR to regularly service and replace as mutually agreed upon with the Student Affairs Dining Group.

- b) The CONTRACTOR is required to coordinate with the UNIVERSITY to have all replacement air conditioning systems be designed and constructed to tie into a chilled water plant and direct digital control system if already in place at the facility.
- 2) The UNIVERSITY is responsible for the maintenance of exterior doors, exterior windows, and roofs.
- 3) The CONTRACTOR shall bear the cost of cleaning and maintaining the related building ventilation and fire suppression systems, including the deep cleaning of all exhaust hoods and related duct work, as required by local and national regulations.
- 4) The CONTRACTOR shall bear the cost of cleaning and maintaining grease traps in a manner that complies with the ordinances of the State of Hawai'i and the County of Hawai'i. This includes being responsible for the cost of cleanup in the event of spills.
- 5) The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for cleaning of all concession areas, including wiping the tables and seating on a regular basis during service. Regularly scheduled deep cleaning shall be included as part of the CONTRACTOR'S cleaning program.
- 6) The CONTRACTOR and its assigned custodial and maintenance staff shall also be responsible for the areas fronting all entrances. This includes providing and maintaining high-quality weather-proof entrance mats at all entrances. The CONTRACTOR shall also be responsible for maintaining trash bins and removing its own trash.
- 7) The CONTRACTOR will be responsible for all costs to maintain pest control services in all assigned areas for the control of insects, rodents, and vermin.
- 8) The CONTRACTOR will provide daily housekeeping, cleaning, maintenance, and sanitation to include supplying necessary commercial equipment and supplies for dedicated food service areas. In addition, the CONTRACTOR will maintain the dining room throughout the service hours to include wiping down tables, cleaning spills, emptying trash, and keeping the dining rooms neat. These facilities include, but are not limited to, production and serving areas, dining rooms, convenience stores/snack bars, refrigerators, freezers, receiving and storage, trash and garbage, employee locker and restrooms, offices, hallways, stairs, and related spaces used by the CONTRACTOR.
- 9) The CONTRACTOR will ensure that all employees are trained in the highest standards of sanitation and safety and supervised in a "clean as you go" policy that will result in a clean and orderly facility at all times.
- 10) The CONTRACTOR will develop, implement, and update cleaning and sanitation schedules for all equipment and areas as assigned. Cleaning must be sufficient to provide preventative maintenance against

- unnecessary deterioration, and provide a clean, neat, and sanitary appearance. Upon review and approval by the UNIVERSITY, schedules will be posted and implemented within THIRTY (30) days from the beginning of the Agreement.
- 11) When the Dining Service areas are closed for UNIVERSITY holidays, these areas will be left in a clean and ready-for-inspection condition.
- 12) The CONTRACTOR will be responsible for providing, cleaning, and maintaining an adequate inventory of table linens, employee uniforms, aprons, towels, and other related dining service linens.
- 13) The CONTRACTOR will be responsible for providing food handler certificates and/or medical examinations as required by law and will make such records available for review upon UNIVERSITY request.
- 14) The CONTRACTOR'S employees will be in uniform and wear a visible nametag identification at all times while on duty. Management will be appropriately dressed (but not necessarily in uniform) and wear nametag identification. The CONTRACTOR'S employees will be neat and tidy in appearance and will follow established hygiene legal mandates and food service industry best practices for employees handling food.
- 15) The CONTRACTOR will not allow employees to work with known illnesses (which are transmitted through the air or via the food products, equipment, or other mediums), open sores, or other symptoms. Any contagious disease such as hepatitis must be reported immediately to the UNIVERSITY.
- 16) The CONTRACTOR is encouraged to follow and promote sustainable practices in line with industry practices. These sustainable practices should be geared towards reducing utility costs for the UNIVERSITY and promoting good environmental stewardship.
- 17) The CONTRACTOR will comply with both present and future recycling programs as adopted by the UNIVERSITY. The CONTRACTOR is expected to recycle or donate excess food, packaging, and other items as they comply with UNIVERSITY policies and meet state and local sanitation and safety regulations. The UNIVERSITY has provided bins for recyclables. It will be the CONTRACTOR'S responsibility to remove such items from its spaces to the proper receptacles at their respective service dock locations.
- 18) The CONTRACTOR will immediately report fires, unsafe conditions, thefts, and security hazards to the UNIVERSITY. The CONTRACTOR will immediately fix and report to the UNIVERSITY any conditions cited in any citations by local, state, or federal agencies or those identified by the Contract Administrator for unsafe conditions to the UNIVERSITY.

19) The UNIVERSITY will furnish and maintain fire extinguisher equipment, alarms and supplies. The CONTRACTOR will notify the UNIVERSITY immediately after any fire extinguisher use or discharge.

# F. SPACE USE

- The UNIVERSITY retains the right, without unreasonably interfering with normal food service, to use the dining areas for a variety of programmed activities that may or may not be food service related. The UNIVERSITY will notify the CONTRACTOR prior to such usage. The UNIVERSITY will perform appropriate setup and cleanup with no cost charged to the CONTRACTOR. Facilities will be restored to conditions mutually satisfactory to the CONTRACTOR and the UNIVERSITY at the conclusion of the non-food service use.
- When the CONTRACTOR uses areas that are not assigned to it pursuant to the Agreement, or which are not primarily intended for dining service, e.g., meeting rooms and lounges for such purposes (cater meals, receptions, etc.), the CONTRACTOR will perform the appropriate setup and cleanup for that area. Facilities will be restored to conditions satisfactory to the UNIVERSITY before the next scheduled use of the area. This includes maintenance and sanitation of the area, furniture rearrangement, and equipment and trash removal.
- All signage and marketing installed by the CONTRACTOR shall be approved in advance by the UNIVERSITY. No handwritten signage is allowed.
- 4) The CONTRACTOR shall install (or maintain) digital menu boards within the various concession facilities.
- 5) Assigned Mānoa Dining Services kitchen space under this CONTRACT may be utilized to provide service to the University of Hawai'i Children's Center as long as the CONTRACTOR provides the service without negatively impacting the performance of this CONTRACT. The Student Affairs Dining Group must be presented information on the potential impact and must approve before the CONTRACTOR may bid on or use any Mānoa Dining Services kitchen spaces to provide this service.

#### G. SECURITY

The UNIVERSITY will provide general security to the campus locations occupied by the CONTRACTOR. It is agreed that the campus locations assigned to the CONTRACTOR are for use solely to fulfill the CONTRACTOR'S duties, and that the CONTRACTOR will, at all times, keep UNIVERSITY facilities secured. In the event the CONTRACTOR is required to share premises, e.g., when a dining room is used for programming, the UNIVERSITY will return the Dining Room to its standard of security during those times when the CONTRACTOR'S portion of the facility is closed. The CONTRACTOR will be responsible for

- any loss or damage resulting from the CONTRACTOR'S failure to provide adequate security under these circumstances. The CONTRACTOR shall immediately report to the UNIVERSITY all facts relating to losses incurred as a result of break-in.
- 2) The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for control of keys and/or electronic access obtained from the UNIVERSITY, and the security of the assigned areas, to include responsible accounting of any keys or locking devices provided to the CONTRACTOR at the onset of the contract. The CONTRACTOR will be responsible for the cost of replacement of lost keys.
- 3) If the UNIVERSITY determines that keys lost by the CONTRACTOR or its employees could compromise campus security, the CONTRACTOR will be responsible for paying all costs associated with re-keying designated locations. Prior to the commencement of the Agreement, or at any time during the Agreement term, the CONTRACTOR may request the UNIVERSITY to re-key the facilities with the CONTRACTOR paying any costs of such re- keying.
- The CONTRACTOR will be responsible for immediately reporting to the UNIVERSITY Security any break-ins or unauthorized entries into the food service areas and all property losses associated therewith. The CONTRACTOR will be responsible for reporting to the UNIVERSITY all accidents involving its staff or customers and all disputes or behavioral incidents involving staff, students or patrons that occur in or around the premises. The UNIVERSITY will not be responsible for the criminal acts of third parties. The CONTRACTOR is required to have procedures to minimize unauthorized access.

#### H. MARKETING

- The CONTRACTOR is responsible for developing and implementing a robust marketing program to advertise and promote the Mānoa Dining Services program to students, faculty and staff, and the campus community. The UNIVERSITY will reasonably cooperate with the CONTRACTOR in promoting and merchandising services and products to attract more customers and to more fully utilize the dining services.
- 2) The CONTRACTOR will be responsible for all costs associated with advertising and promotional efforts through printed or other media vehicles. At a minimum, the CONTRACTOR will disseminate to student, faculty, and staff information brochures, catering menus, and other communications as mutually agreed upon by the Student Affairs Dining Group.
- 3) All advertising and promotional efforts will be coordinated through the Student Affairs Dining Group at least TWO (2) weeks prior to publication and distribution.

4) The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for the marketing and sales of meal plans and working with appropriate UNIVERSITY offices to provide incoming students and their families information on the various meal plan options. The CONTRACTOR shall develop a comprehensive marketing plan to include strategies for advertising, customer relations, public relations, merchandising, and promotions within FORTY-FIVE (45) days of the execution of the CONTRACT. The marketing plan shall also include the CONTRACTOR'S strategy on social media and online marketing.

### I. CUSTOMER ANALYTICS

- The CONTRACTOR shall conduct a customer satisfaction survey at least once a year, late in the fall semester. The CONTRACTOR will cooperate with the UNIVERSITY in monitoring customer satisfaction for value received through an objective evaluation system involving customer representation from a cross section of the campus community demographic including guest customers. All survey instruments used must be approved by the Student Affairs Dining Group prior to distribution and all survey results must be submitted to the UNIVERSITY.
- 2) The UNIVERSITY expects that the food and staff satisfaction surveys record at minimum a 75%-80% and above satisfaction level for all services and year after year improvement.

#### J. FOOD SERVICE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Student Affairs Dining Group shall act as the advisory committee for the Mānoa Dining Service Program. Membership of this group shall rest with the Vice Chancellor for Students and include members from Student Housing Services and Student Life & Development. The CONTRACTOR will regularly meet with the Student Affairs Dining Group members to discuss a variety of issues including, but not limited to, menus and specials, pricing, portions, special menu programming, preparation and service standards, hours of operation, dining trends, marketing, and customer requests.

#### K. NUTRITION AWARENESS

- A nutrition awareness program planned and executed under the leadership of the CONTRACTOR shall be provided as a self-education tool and be designed to communicate in a positive and upbeat style through a variety of informational formats. An emphasis of the program shall be the need for a commitment to lifelong maintenance of good health through correct eating habits and physical activity. "Light Choice" items adhering to the American Heart Association's dietary guidelines shall be available and highlighted in daily menus of both residential and retail facilities.
- 2) Meals shall include a sufficient number and variety of low calorie, low fat and low cholesterol foods so that an individual can maintain a low fat and

low cholesterol diet without requesting special foods for preparation. This shall include a variety of vegan and gluten free menu items.

3) The program shall meet the following minimum nutrition awareness requirements:

Provision of nutritional analysis, by portion, of each menu item, to indicate amounts of calories, fat (animal fat must be clearly identified), sodium, sugar, carbohydrates, etc. This information must be posted by the serving area for each of the food items. Availability of recipe files for customer review of nutrition information is a requirement.

4) To accommodate the food service customer preferences, the CONTRACTOR'S on-site management should have the ability to alter recipes for reduction of certain ingredients such as salt, fat, and sugar content. All condiments shall be available for students who prefer hot and spicy, sweet, salty, or other flavor enhancers.

# L. <u>MENU</u>

- Menu selections shall be planned to enable the UNIVERSITY community clientele to meet appropriate recommended dietary allowances set by the Food and Nutrition Board of the National Research Council. In addition to popularity and cost factors, menus shall be planned to be appealing to sight, taste and smell and shall take into consideration contrasts in color, shape, texture, and flavor of foods.
- Weekly board and retail menus shall be designed to be attractive and posted in prominent places in the dining areas and other locations agreed upon with the Student Affairs Dining Group. Daily menus shall be posted in prominent locations of the dining areas and substitution of menu items shall be noted. Menus shall be available at least SEVENTY-TWO (72) hours before they go into effect in both print and electronic mediums. The CONTRACTOR may propose other forms of menu distribution.

#### M. PURCHASING STANDARDS

- 1) Food purchased by the CONTRACTOR for use at the UNIVERSITY shall meet or exceed the purchasing specifications for each item listed below. Minimum food specifications are as follows:
  - a) Beef and Veal USDA Choice, except for meat used in extended dishes that may be USDA Standard
  - b) Pork and Lamb USDA Grade A (#1)
  - c) Poultry USDA Grade A
  - d) Seafood USDA Grade A

- e) Eggs USDA Grade A (Large or Medium)
- f) Dairy Products USDA Grade A
- g) Frozen Foods USDA Grade A Fancy
- h) Fresh Produce USDA #1 Quality
- i) Canned Foods USDA Grade "A" Fancy, except Choice may be used for cooking purposes; fruits should be packed in light syrups.
- j) Cheeses such as cheddar, Swiss, and Monterey jack shall be all natural, non- processed, when served as a prime ingredient in an entree, a sandwich ingredient, and sandwich spreads. American processed cheese may also be served as an alternative sandwich ingredient. In addition, processed cheese may be used in some cooking or as a less expensive alternative for some non-entree foods.
- k) Ground Beef USDA Standard or better, ground beef and beef patties shall be 100% all beef and fat content shall not exceed 20%.
- Veal and Pork steaks shall be solid meat portions un-breaded and not preformed from chopped or ground meat.
- m) Frankfurters/Hot Dogs maximum eight per pound, all meat, no filler. Turkey franks may be used as an alternate to satisfy certain health and ethnic diet requirements.
- n) Processed lunch meats such as bologna and salami shall be a quality "all meat" or a turkey product.
- o) Whole meat as defined for the dinner meal will include roasts, chops, chicken, etc. Fish will be an appropriate substitute for the whole meat requirement one (1) night per week. This is not intended to restrict more frequent selections of fish. Chopped formed patties, frequently called steaks, will not satisfy the whole meat requirement.
- 2) All meat shall be cut to USDA I.M.P specifications. All meat cuts shall be in accordance with USDA I.M.P. specifications. The items/portions listed later in this section are intended as minimum standards only, and the CONTRACTOR is encouraged to exceed these minimum standards wherever possible. All other foodstuffs not included in the above specifications shall be of comparable quality.
- 3) Purchase of food, supplies, and equipment shall meet requirements of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Food and Drug

Administrations (FDA), and National Sanitation Foundation (NSF). In the absence of grade labeling, the CONTRACTOR shall provide the UNIVERSITY, upon request, with package labeling codes or industry accepted grade equivalent standard to verify the minimum grades specified are being provided. In addition, the CONTRACTOR must be prepared to assure the UNIVERSITY that all of its food and supply vendors meet, if not exceed, all regulatory body laws and standards.

- 4) The CONTRACTOR shall maintain rigid procurement procedures throughout the entire process of purchasing, receiving, storing, and inventorying of all foods and direct supplies.
- 5) The UNIVERSITY reserves the right to periodically inspect the CONTRACTOR'S inventory of food and supplies or review invoices to ensure that purchase standards are maintained.
- 6) The CONTRACTOR will establish a local purchasing program with vendors. There are currently FIFTY-FOUR (54) local purveyors that provide produce, meat, dairy, breads, beverages and more to the CONTRACTOR. This local program will be marketed and promoted to the Campus Community.

### N. PREPARATION STANDARDS

- 1) The CONTRACTOR shall prepare all food on the premises on the day it is served. Food for all Mānoa Dining Services program locations shall be cooked fresh during the serving period. Advanced preparation and cooking shall be kept at a minimum, so freshness and quality may be maintained.
- 2) The general policy shall be to limit the number of fully pre-prepared food items and to do on the premises preparation of food items and batch cooking as close to time of service as possible. Cook-to-order and progressive cooking should be the normal method of operation, staggering the preparation of food whenever possible so that nutritional value, temperature, and overall quality can be maintained during serving hours.
- Recipes standardized for quality, yield, cooking procedures, serving containers and utensils, and portion size shall be used in all production units.
- 4) Leftover foods shall be kept to a minimum, refrigerated as necessary in shallow pans after each meal, properly covered, and used promptly. All leftovers that require refrigeration shall be properly chilled and stored in one location labeled and dated and served within TWENTY-FOUR (24) hours as an extra selection. Leftovers containing items previously frozen cannot be frozen.

- 5) Vegetable shortening rather than animal shortening must be used for food prepared on site. The CONTRACTOR is strongly encouraged to purchase food prepared with vegetable shortening. If this is not possible, then the food served must be clearly labeled as containing animal fat.
- 6) All meals shall be provided with assorted beverages to include a minimum of: coffee, milk, hot chocolate, FOUR (4) types of soda (TWO [2] regular and TWO [2] diet); TWO (2) types of fruit flavored drinks, TWO (2) types of fresh juices (fruit and vegetable); and tea (regular and varieties of herbal).
- 7) All meals shall be provided with assorted spice tray to include: Hot sauce (Tabasco), Heinz steak sauce ("57"), Worcestershire sauce, soy sauce, A-1 sauce, salt, black pepper, garlic salt, chili powder, celery salt, curry powder, ketchup, and mustard. All meals shall be provided with assorted condiments to include TWO (2) types of peanut butter, TWO (2) types of jelly or jam, honey, sugar, and butter or margarine.

### O. <u>SERVICE STANDARDS</u>

- 1) All serving stations and bars are to be well stocked throughout the entire posted serving times.
- 2) The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for setting up, stocking and maintaining stations with appropriate condiments and utensils.
- 3) Display and serving areas shall be clean, sanitary, orderly, and attractive at all times. Any spillage or soiled spots shall be removed promptly from counters, steam table pans, general serving and dining areas and floors. Partially used and broken items shall be promptly removed from the area.
- 4) Hot foods are to be served hot (above 145 degrees Fahrenheit) and cold foods are to be served cold (below 40 degrees Fahrenheit).
- 5) All food shall be garnished for attractive presentation.
- 6) Any food appearing discolored, unappealing, or not in a proper state of freshness shall not be served. The CONTRACTOR shall adhere to the general food service industry guide: "If you are not willing to purchase or consume the product yourself, it should not be displayed."
- 7) When applicable (conferences, weekend brunches, etc.) any "all you care to eat" operations serving stations and bars are to be kept well stocked throughout each serving period. The last customer is to be offered the same range of choice as the first customer. All food items other than desserts will remain at their respective stations for a minimum of FIFTEEN (15) minutes after the posted closing time. Desserts must remain available for a minimum of THIRTY (30) minutes after the posted closing time.

- 8) Food items at the servicing stations and salad bars shall be readily identifiable with attractive and individual labels.
- 9) Appropriate wrappings for grab and go foods shall be used as needed. Wrapping shall be both attractive, and serviceable, and, if possible, made of sustainable and/or recyclable materials.
- 10) Display and serving areas shall be kept clean, sanitary, orderly, and attractive at all times. Any spillage or soiled spots shall be removed promptly from counters, steam table pans, general serving and dining areas, and floors. Partially used and broken items shall be promptly removed from the serving area.
- 11) Exam Weeks In addition to the specified special meals, the CONTRACTOR is encouraged to provide a variety of "treats" or late-night meals that are designed to be educational and social and add a surprise element to the Mānoa Dining Services program. This includes extending business hours and working closely with student programming to support exam week services.
- 12) The CONTRACTOR shall at minimum accept cash, debit/credit cards, Dining Dollars, Campus Cash, Apple Pay, Google Pay and meal plan equivalency swipes.

### P. SPECIAL DIETS

The CONTRACTOR shall provide special diets for students when approved in writing by the designated UNIVERSITY representative and Contract Administrator. The CONTRACTOR shall work with a registered dietitian to assist its management in providing the diets as approved. The cost of special diet meals shall not exceed the food cost equivalent of the daily rate meals.

### Q. HOURS

- The CONTRACTOR shall utilize the hours of service outlined in Attachments B and C.as a guide for the first year of operation. After which, the CONTRACTOR shall establish mutually agreed upon hours of operation through the Student Affairs Dining Group. If mutually agreed upon hours of operation cannot be established, the hours in Attachments B and C shall be used as the standard minimum hours of operation.
- 2) Once established, hours of operation may not be changed without the express written permission of the Contract Administrator.
- 3) Retail dining locations must remain open to new customers at least FIVE (5) minutes past the advertised closing time to help prevent service issues.
- 4) During academic recesses and holiday periods, the hours of operation may be adjusted or suspended if approved by the Contract Administrator.

### R. PERMIT AND LICENSES

The CONTRACTOR shall, at its own expense, obtain all necessary permits, give all necessary notices, pay all license fees, and comply with all laws, rules, ordinances, and regulations applicable to the business carried on under this CONTRACT.

### S. <u>COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS, RULES AND POLICIES</u>

The CONTRACTOR must comply with all UNIVERSITY policies, county ordinances and/or State and federal law that may be applicable to its performance under the CONTRACT.

### T. FOOD STOCKS

The CONTRACTOR shall keep a sufficient variety and quantity of food in stock on the premises or accessible at a purveyor's warehouse to enable the CONTRACTOR to continue the food service concession operations for at least SEVEN (7) days in case of cessation of food deliveries to the State of Hawai'i. The CONTRACTOR shall provide for any and all other expenses incurred in food service operations, including the cost of obtaining foodstuffs via air freight, that enable the CONTRACTOR to continue the food service operations in the event of a shipping and/or dock strike.

### U. <u>LIQUOR LICENSE</u>

The CONTRACTOR shall obtain the necessary licenses to provide for the sale and serving of beer, wine, and other alcoholic beverages. The CONTRACTOR agrees the sale of all alcoholic beverages shall be in strict conformance with the UNIVERSITY'S policies and procedures, and the City and County of Honolulu Liquor Commission's rules and regulations. The CONTRACTOR shall obtain prior approval for prices, locations and operating policies and procedures from the Student Affairs Dining Group. Any and all violations or possible infractions of the Hawai'i Revised Statutes or Liquor Commission Rules and Regulations that involve alcohol on the licensed premises must be reported to the CONTRACT Administrator within 24-hours of the incident. A written report shall be provided to the Contract Administrator within THREE (3) work days

### V. PROGRAMMING SUPPORT

- The CONTRACTOR shall arrange to incorporate a variety of stakeholder programs, special theme meals, late night breakfast meals, snacks & coffee service during finals period, holiday meals, etc. to support and promote campus and student life initiatives and programming. Student life initiatives may include programs that relate to student food insecurities and supporting related UNIVERSITY initiatives.
- 2) Working with authorized designees, the CONTRACTOR shall arrange to incorporate a variety of special programming theme meals consistent with nationally and locally recognized days, weeks or months (e.g. Cinco de Mayo, Black History Month, Native American Heritage Week, Makahiki, Boys/Girls Day from Japan, etc.). The CONTRACTOR shall design no-frills,

affordable items available for purchase to support campus and student life special programming initiatives. All special programming shall be approved in advance by the Student Affairs Dining Group.

3) The CONTRACTOR shall develop a semester plan to address special programming prior to the start of each semester. The CONTRACTOR shall develop program plans for student life programming initiatives that are deemed as pilot programs. The CONTRACTOR shall include the financial impact of the proposed special programming initiatives.

### W. RECRUITMENT ASSISTANCE

In support of the UNIVERSITY'S recruitment efforts, the CONTRACTOR shall provide paid guest meals to prospective students and families who attend special undergraduate recruitment activities as planned by the Office of Admissions and Records, and authorized by the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Students.

### X. ONE CARD PROGRAM

- The UNIVERSITY operates and maintains a campus identification One Card Program that not only provides each member of the campus community with a single recognizable identification card, but also affords the community member access to a variety of services offered by a number of UNIVERSITY offices, programs, and departments.
- 2) The One Card Program utilizes transactional management software known as Blackboard Transact. The CONTRACTOR will be required to assign personnel to learn and use the system to manage meal plan and stored value accounts associated with the Mānoa Dining Services program. The assigned CONTRACTOR staff will be required to add, monitor, and remove, meal plan assignments. This will include managing the meal plan points included with the meal plans as well as a system of checks and balances to help prevent inaccuracies and unlawful activity.
- 3) The UNIVERSITY requires that all sales of resident meal plans be posted through the student accounts on the UNIVERSITY'S Student Information System (Banner) that serves to collect tuition, room and board payments, and other associated educational expenses. The Banner Student Information System integrates with the One Card System (Blackboard Transact) to populate customer records.
- 4) The CONTRACTOR shall use the Sequoia Point of Sale (POS) terminals, register hardware, and operating software system that the UNIVERSITY currently owns and operates for the Mānoa Dining Services program. Should the CONTRACTOR decide to replace this system ahead of its useful life, the CONTRACTOR must get approval from the Student Affairs Dining Group and shall absorb the full financial cost of doing so. The replacement system would also need to integrate with the Blackboard Transact software.
- 5) The CONTRACTOR shall be transferred all active Dining Dollar balances at the start of the contract and shall be responsible for the acceptance and usage of Dining Dollars as a part of the Mānoa Dining Services program.

Active Dining Dollar balances are balances on user accounts that have had at least ONE (1) transaction within the past TWO (2) years from the transfer date. The CONTRACTOR'S responsibility for the acceptance and usage of Dining Dollars shall include the cost to maintain the Dining Dollars website portals and the mobile application through Blackboard Inc., the current One Card software provider, so that customers can continue to check and purchase additional Dining Dollars online or on the mobile application. The setup of routing online sales to the CONTRACTOR'S designated account and management of the web portals shall be coordinated through the UH Mānoa One Card Office. Additional transaction fees shall not be added to customers unless approved by the Student Affairs Dining Group.

6) The CONTRACTOR shall accept Campus Cash at all dining locations at the established 5% per transaction rate collected by the One Card Program to help cover credit card fees, the cost of the mobile application and online customer account portals, and support.

### Y. INSPECTIONS AND EVALUATIONS

- The UNIVERSITY reserves the right to periodically conduct announced or unannounced inspections and request changes in the operation and condition of the concession service and facilities at any time with respect to quality, quantity and production of all food items, hours of concession service, prices, safety, sanitation and maintenance of the facilities and equipment, in order to bring them to levels satisfactory to the UNIVERSITY. Inspectors from all state and local authorities and from the UNIVERSITY shall have complete cooperation from the CONTRACTOR. Inspections and evaluations shall be conducted as best as possible to not interfere with the normal operations.
- 2) The CONTRACTOR is responsible for ensuring that all Mānoa Dining Services locations inspected by the Department of Health receive a "PASS" rating from the Department of Health. When state and local authorities arrive for inspection, the UNIVERSITY shall be notified and, whenever practical, be present for the inspection. A copy of the inspection report shall be transmitted by the CONTRACTOR to the UNIVERSITY within SEVENTY-TWO (72) hours of receipt. Within FIVE (5) working days, the CONTRACTOR shall provide the UNIVERSITY with a written report of corrective action. In the event that corrective action is a joint responsibility, the CONTRACTOR shall notify the UNIVERSITY of its responsibility in the matter and shall work with the UNIVERSITY on the implementation of the corrective action(s).
- 3) The CONTRACTOR will work with the Student Affairs Dining Group, at no cost to the UNIVERSITY, to establish a "secret shopper" type evaluation program to periodically evaluate the CONTRACTOR'S food quality and service.

### Z. <u>ACCOUNTING AND FISCAL MANAGEMENT</u>

- The CONTRACTOR shall account for all revenue and expenditures for the Mānoa Dining Services program by cost center on a monthly calendar basis to correspond with the UNIVERSITY'S fiscal yearly reporting period of July 1st through June 30th.
  - a) The CONTRACTOR shall submit a monthly financial Operating Statement to provide a detailed breakdown of the prior month and year to date financial performance (including variance percentages) by cost center no later than TWO (2) weeks after the 1st of the month.
  - b) The Student Affairs Dining Group shall conduct reviews of the operating statement for the purpose of assessing financial performance and to determine whether action is warranted by the CONTRACTOR to make operational adjustments.
  - c) The CONTRACTOR shall establish mutually agreed upon financial performance goals with the Student Affairs Dining Group. The financial performance goals and monthly/annual financial performance will be summarized by the CONTRACTOR and presented for review during a monthly meeting with the Student Affairs Dining Group.
- All funds collected under the CONTRACT shall be held separate from any other account(s) of CONTRACTOR and shall not be commingled with any funds not related to the CONTRACT.
- 3) All payments to vendors shall be made by the CONTRACTOR within THIRTY (30) days after the services have been performed or the goods have been received.
- 4) The CONTRACTOR shall maintain accurate, complete and separate books of accounts according to generally accepted accounting principles with appropriate supporting data and documents.
- 5) The CONTRACTOR shall maintain, at a minimum, the following statements and journals:
  - a) Income Register Maintain a monthly income register to record revenues and any vendor rebates received.
  - b) Disbursements Journal Maintain a monthly disbursement journal to record operating disbursements.
  - c) Revenue and Expense Statement Provide to the UNIVERSITY a monthly summary of income and cash disbursements. Copies of all invoices paid shall be made available upon request. Annual statements shall be provided within SIXTY (60) days after the close of the fiscal year.

- d) Reconciliation Reports Provide to the UNIVERSITY a monthly reconciliation report of income and disbursements with copies of bank statements for Mānoa Dining Services program account.
- e) Accounts Receivable Report Provide to the UNIVERSITY a monthly Accounts Receivable report including current accounts of CONTRACTOR'S receipt of collection reports, outstanding receivables, delinquent receivables, and uncollectible accounts. Accounts receivable reports shall be provided within TEN (10) calendar days after the end of the previous month.
- 6) All books of accounts and supporting data and documents shall be available for inspection, reproduction, or audit by the UNIVERSITY at all reasonable times during the CONTRACT Term. If a dispute, discrepancy, litigation, or claim is instituted before the expiration of the TEN (10) year period, the CONTRACTOR shall retain all books of account, data, and supporting documents until such disputes, discrepancies, claims, litigation, or audit findings are resolved.
- 7) The UNIVERSITY reserves the right, at its expense, to audit or cause to be audited the CONTRACTOR'S books and accounts with the UNIVERSITY at any time during the term of this CONTRACT and for TEN (10) years thereafter.
- 8) The CONTRACTOR shall reimburse the UNIVERSITY from the CONTRACTOR'S own funds for loss of commission revenue due to inaccurate bookkeeping and accounting.

### AA. CAPITAL INVESTMENT

- 1) Capital investments provided to the UNIVERSITY shall be used for the sole purpose of capital improvements to Mānoa Dining Services locations as approved in advance and in writing by the UNIVERSITY and CONTRACTOR. The allowable expenditures shall include, but not be limited to the replacement of furniture, fixtures, and equipment, renovation, remodeling, additions and new construction of Mānoa Dining Services facilities and related cost for consulting, engineering, architectural and interior design, signage, shipping, travel expenses, inspections, surveys, and debt service, all in accordance with applicable federal, state, and county laws, rules, and other regulations.
- The capital investment funds shall be deposited in a designated escrow account established by the CONTRACTOR and deposited through an escrow company in the State of Hawaii to be determined by the UNIVERSITY.
  - a) The CONTRACTOR shall deposit on the first day of the CONTRACT TWENTY-FIVE PERCENT (25%) of the CONTRACTOR'S specified capital investment in the OFFER into the escrow account.

- b) The CONTRACTOR shall deposit the remaining SEVENTY-FIVE PERCENT (75%) of the specified capital investment into the escrow account within the first FIVE (5) years of the CONTRACT.
- c) The CONTRACTOR shall report all deposits, earnings, withdrawals, expenditures, and the beginning and ending balances of the escrow account as a part of the monthly and annual financial reporting.
- d) Any interest accrued in the escrow account shall be used for the sole purpose of capital improvements to Mānoa Dining Services locations.
- e) The UNIVERSITY shall establish terms and conditions governing the account prior to the effective date of the CONTRACT. These terms and conditions shall be binding on the CONTRACTOR.
- If the CONTRACT is terminated by the UNIVERSITY for convenience, or without cause, the UNIVERSITY shall assess within THIRTY (30) days any remaining unamortized portion of the capital investment agreed upon to the CONTRACTOR. Should there be an unamortized capital investment balance remaining, the UNIVERSITY shall reimburse the CONTRACTOR for capital investment made by the CONTRACTOR by paying any remaining unamortized portion of the capital investment agreed upon to the CONTRACTOR within THIRTY (30) days after the assessment. The amortization schedule for capital investment shall use generally accepted accounting standards agreed upon by the UNIVERSITY and CONTRACTOR [straight line basis] from the first day of the CONTRACT over a period of FIFTEEN (15) years. Therefore, the assessment or reimbursement shall be computed by [multiplying the total capital investment amount by the remaining months of the CONTRACT divided by 180 months] taking the capital investment amount agreed upon less the total amortization allowed.
  - a) In the event that the UNIVERSITY is owed money at the time of termination, the amount owed shall be paid to the University within THIRTY (30) days in the form of a cashier's check or a certified check drawn on a bank which is insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. The remaining balance, if any, in the capital investment escrow account shall then be released to the CONTRACTOR.
  - b) In the event that the CONTRACTOR is owed money at the time of termination, the remaining balance in the capital investment escrow account shall be released to the CONTRACTOR in satisfaction of this debt. Any additional amount owed shall be amortized over the remainder of the term of the CONTRACT and shall be reimbursed to the CONTRACTOR in equal annual installment payments at the beginning of each fiscal year following the effective date of the termination of the CONTRACT.
- 4) If the CONTRACT is terminated by the UNIVERSITY for cause prior to the end of CONTRACT term, the CONTRACTOR shall pay to the UNIVERSITY the balance of the accounts within THIRTY (30) days after the termination of

- the CONTRACT in the form of a cashier's check or certified check on a bank that is insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.
- 5) At the expiration of the CONTRACT, the balance remaining in the capital improvements escrow account shall be paid to the UNIVERSITY within THIRTY (30) days of the expiration of the CONTRACT in the form of a cashier's check or a certified check drawn on a bank which is insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

## SECTION 3 OFFER REQUIREMENTS

### 3.1 INTRODUCTION

This section outlines the OFFER requirements for this CFO, which shall be submitted by the deadline set for submission of OFFERS. Fulfillment of all OFFER requirements listed is mandatory for consideration of OFFERS.

The OFFER shall include the following:

- A. Offer Letter
- B. Project Narrative
- C. Financial Pro Forma
- D. References

### 3.2 OFFER LETTER (APPENDIX A)

The OFFER Letter shown in **APPENDIX A** shall be signed by an individual authorized to legally bind the OFFEROR, dated, and be affixed with the corporate seal (if corporate seal is available). If said individual is not the corporate president, evidence shall be submitted showing the individual's authority to bind the corporation. The fully executed OFFER letter shall be submitted along with the OFFER.

### 3.3 PROJECT NARRATIVE (**APPENDIX B**)

- A. Indicate commission and capital investment on OFFER (See APPENDIX C).
- B. The Project Narrative shall provide the information and be in the format requested in **APPENDIX B**. It shall explain how the objectives and requirements of the Mānoa Dining Services program stated in SECTION 2 will be met and exceeded. The Project Narrative shall also include a sample maintenance and cleaning schedule, a transition plan (if applicable), a description of innovative retail dining concepts and major capital improvements being proposed during the CONTRACT Term per the **Special Provisions Section 5.18**.

### 3.4 FINANCIAL PRO FORMA AND WORKSHEETS (APPENDIX D)

OFFEROR shall provide a Financial Pro Forma and a brief explanation for line item assumptions that demonstrate how the OFFEROR'S company envisions improving the financial position of the operations over the next FIFTEEN (15) years. OFFERORS shall include the Financial Pro Forma Worksheets indicated in **APPENDIX D**. The Financial Pro Forma should take into consideration the growth rate of the campus and areas new and updated retail concepts that the OFFEROR anticipates to be areas of growth and opportunity for the campus and community. The Financial Pro Forma should also include any opportunities for reducing Mānoa Dining Services program utilities expenses. Offerors shall include in their Financial Pro Forma the following costs and assumptions:

- A. Year ONE (1) data includes a full fiscal year starting (July 1st through June 30th), regardless of whatever the actual CONTRACT start date will be.
- B. Utility costs (electricity, gas, water, sewage).

- C. Assume Resident Hall beds are 2,576 (not including staff) and Apartments are 1088 (not including staff).
- D. Assume on campus occupancy is 92% for Fall and Spring semesters and Apartment students on meal plans are 25%.
- E. Assume meal plan service dates for the total include: EIGHTEEN (18) weeks for fall, EIGHTEEN (18) weeks for spring, and TWELVE (12) weeks for summer.
- F. OFFERORS shall provide their projected breakdown as it relates to their offer.
- G. Assume and include any taxes that may be realized such as general excise taxes.
- H. Include anticipated costs for food service equipment repair and replacement for the duration of the CONTRACT Term as stated in SECTION 2.
- I. The current price increase for Meal Plans for FY19 was THREE PERCENT (3%). Proposed pricing of Meal Plans shall not increase dramatically from year to year to keep prices low and affordable. Retail pricing, especially for nationally branded operations should not be more than off-campus pricing of similar or same types of items.

### 3.5 REFERENCES (APPENDIX E)

OFFERORS shall provide a minimum of FIVE (5) references in either the educational, private non-profit, or public sector for who similar concessions have been operated. The names of companies, addresses, phone numbers, contact persons and email addresses shall be furnished. The UNIVERSITY reserves the right to contact the references for additional information.

### 3.6 OFFEROR'S SUBMITTALS CHECKLIST

### 3.7 OFFEROR'S PRESENTATION

OFFERORS may present their offer to the Student Affairs Dining Group CONTRACT review committee. The presentation is not a requirement for submission of an OFFER to the UNIVERSITY. The presentation shall be used for the purpose of clarifying the OFFER

submitted. Presentations shall be limited to THIRTY (30) minutes with up to THIRTY (30) additional minutes allotted for Questions and Answers. OFFERORS are not required to present in person and may arrange a phone conference, webinar, etc. for the same purposes. OFFERORS are required to notify the Technical Representative of the University to schedule the presentation by March 11, 2019 (deadline to submit questions). Presentations will be held from April 3, 2019 through April 5, 2019.

# SECTION 4 CRITERIA TO EVALUATE OFFERS

The evaluation of Offers received in response to the CFO will be conducted comprehensively, fairly, and impartially. A CONTRACT will be awarded to the responsive, responsible OFFEROR whose Offer is determined in writing to be the most advantageous to the UNIVERSITY, taking into consideration the evaluation factors set forth in this CFO. In the event of a tie from the highest offerors, the UNIVERSITY will request a Best and Final Offer from those offerors.

Offers submitted will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

<u>Evaluation Criteria</u>: UHM Mānoa Dining Services selection committee will use specific criteria to evaluate offers. The total maximum points shall be 100 points.

### 4.1 QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE (10 points maximum)

OFFEROR will be evaluated on the OFFEROR'S NARRATIVE (**Appendix B**) and the OFFEROR'S requisite knowledge, qualifications, and financial capability to successfully perform all requirements of this CFO in accordance with Section 2.4, I, MINIMUM ACCEPTABLE QUALIFICATIONS/EXPERIENCE. Corporate history, experience with higher education institutions and board meal plans, financial ability and the ability to provide goods and services will be evaluated in this section.

### 4.2 PROPOSED PROGRAM PLAN (40 points maximum)

- OFFEROR'S demonstrated understanding of Mānoa Dining Services Program needs as it relates to serving students, faculty and staff, and the campus community.
- OFFEROR'S demonstrated ability to provide a creative and innovative dining program plan for the duration of the CONTRACT. This includes the OFFEROR'S plan to provide nationally recognized retail brand options, as well as giving customers balanced and diverse dining options in terms of food types, price points, and operating hours.
- OFFEROR'S demonstrated ability and resources to expertly execute the proposed creative and innovative dining program plan for the duration of the CONTRACT. This includes the OFFEROR explaining how appropriate purchasing, design, and construction services will be utilized to accomplish the program plan.
- OFFEROR'S ability to communicate their dining program plan to build a responsive, quality and innovative foodservice program.
- OFFEROR'S commitments and proposed practices toward sustainability.
- OFFEROR'S demonstrated ability to address the diverse food needs of the campus.

### 4.3 PROPOSED FINANCIAL AGREEMENT (40 points maximum)

- OFFEROR'S plan to provide commissions to the Office of Student Life and Development and Student Housing Services while improving the Mānoa Dining Services Program.
- OFFEROR'S proposed commissions to the Office of Student Life and Development and Student Housing Services.

- OFFEROR'S demonstrated ability to explain and substantiate projected financial performance.
- OFFEROR'S Capital Investment Plan for improving the program over the duration of the contract. OFFEROR shall provide a breakdown of proposed capital investment US dollar amounts following the CONTRACT escrow account requirements and how the investment will benefit the Mānoa Dining Services program. The US dollar amounts are to be included in the Financial Projection Worksheet (Appendix D). The OFFEROR shall include amortization schedules for any proposed renovation projects.
- OFFEROR'S equipment replacement plan. Offers should only include high-quality commercial Energy Star rated (or similar energy efficient) equipment of a similar or like brand. Offers for new concept equipment must include commercial foodservice equipment of a similar or better quality brand.

# 4.4 <u>ASSESSMENT OF THE OFFEROR'S MANAGEMENT TEAM, RESOURCES, AND REFERENCE CHECKS</u> (10 points maximum)

- This includes an evaluation of the OFFEROR'S Proposed Management Team, and reference checks of company performance and resources.
- OFFEROR'S demonstrated ability to have corporate/headquarters support to the management team on the ground.
- OFFEROR'S demonstrated ability to access additional resources and support to enhance or improve program performance.

# SECTION 5 SPECIAL PROVISIONS

### 5.1 <u>REFERENCES</u>

The UNIVERSITY reserves the right to contact the references named in **APPENDIX E**, REFERENCES, and to reject an Offer submitted by any OFFEROR whose performance on other concessions has been unsatisfactory.

### 5.2 QUALIFICATIONS

- A. OFFERORS shall be national in scope and be currently operating at a minimum of FIVE (5) colleges and universities which have board meal plan operations. Each such account shall have been operating for the past THREE (3) years.
- B. OFFERORS shall have received over \$75 million in gross sales in non-vending college or university food service operations in its last fiscal year.
- C. OFFERORS shall be fully acquainted with conditions relating to the scope and restrictions related to the work under this CFO. The failure or omission of an OFFEROR to be acquainted with existing conditions shall in no way provide relief from any obligation with respect to this CFO or any CONTRACT awarded.
- D. OFFERORS shall demonstrate the ability to provide nationally branded retail concepts.
- E. OFFERORS shall have sufficient personnel and resources to provide the UNIVERSITY with the level of professionalism and quality of food and service expected under this CFO.

### 5.3 PAYMENT

- A. CONTRACTOR shall make monthly commission payments on its monthly gross sales at the commission rate established in its offer to the UNIVERSITY by the 20th day following the close of a calendar month. All payments shall be made payable to the University of Hawai`i at Mānoa and submitted to the Administrative Officer, Office of Student Life and Development, 2465 Campus Road, CC212, Honolulu, HI 96822. The termination of the CONTRACT by default or otherwise shall not relieve the CONTRACTOR of its obligations under the CONTRACT or for charges accrued while the CONTRACT was in effect but remaining unpaid at the time of termination.
- B. Minimum Expected Annual Gross Sales:

The expected annual gross sales amounts stated in the table above are the minimum allowed gross annual sales to be used for purposes of the calculation of the commission rebate due to the UNIVERSITY by the CONTRACTOR.

- Should the actual annual gross sales in a fiscal year be higher than the stated amounts, the UNIVERSITY shall be permitted to retain all monthly commission payments made by the CONTRACTOR during the fiscal year based on the higher amount of actual gross annual sales.
- 2) Should the annual gross sales in a fiscal year be lower than the stated amounts, the CONTRACTOR shall pay the UNIVERSITY the difference between the total monthly commission payments made by the CONTRACTOR to the UNIVERSITY during the fiscal year and the annual commission rate applied to the minimum expected annual gross sales. This deficit in the commission payments due to the UNIVERSITY shall be paid by the CONTRACTOR within TWENTY (20) days of the end of each fiscal year of the term of the contract.
- C. Any amounts owed by the CONTRACTOR under the terms of the CONTRACT shall bear interest from the date such amounts become due until paid. The rate of such interest shall be either (a) at the specific maximum rate, if any, then allowed by the appropriate sections of statutes of Hawai'i, or any successor law or statute, or (b) if there is no such maximum rate, TWO (2) percentage points above the large business prime rate of interest then being charged by the bank principally used by the UNIVERSITY.

### 5.4 <u>CONTRACT INVALIDATION</u>

If any provision of this CONTRACT is found to be invalid, such invalidation will not be construed to invalidate the entire CONTRACT.

### 5.5 PRE-OFFER CONFERENCE

A Pre-Offer conference is scheduled on <u>February 20, 2019, at 9 a.m. at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa at Campus Center Room 309 (2465 Campus Road, Campus Center, Honolulu, Hawaii 96822).</u>

The purpose of this conference is to allow potential OFFERORS an opportunity to present questions and obtain clarification relative to any facet of this solicitation. All OFFERORS are encouraged to attend and satisfy themselves as to the existing conditions and the nature of the

concession described in the CFO. Please advise if any special accommodations are needed. No additional allowance will be granted because of lack of knowledge due to failure to attend the briefing.

### 5.6 <u>SITE VISIT</u>

Each OFFEROR may visit the concession area(s) and examine the conditions of same and be aware or satisfied as to the physical condition and environment in relation to the terms and conditions of specifications included in this CFO. No additional allowance will be granted because of lack of knowledge of such conditions. To facilitate this expectation, a <u>site visit</u> will be conducted following the pre-conference described above.

### 5.7 PROHIBITIONS

- A. The CONTRACTOR shall preclude its employees, representatives, agents and/or subcontractors from:
  - 1) Using the premises for illegal acts or purposes.
  - 2) Using the premises for lodging.
  - 3) Generating or causing the generation of noxious and objectionable smoke, gases, vapors, sound or noises.
  - 4) Storing or accumulating flammable liquids and materials which may invalidate any insurance coverage for fire and safety carried by the UNIVERSITY, as possible noncompliance/non-adherence to applicable Underwriter's rules and regulations or any other codes and ordinances.
  - 5) Posting of unauthorized bills, posters and signs within the premises. Advertising for the facility shall be in accordance with UNIVERSITY regulations, policies and procedures.
  - 6) Stacking of boxes, cartons, barrels or other similar items in an unsightly or unsafe manner on or about the premises.
  - 7) Overloading floors.
  - 8) Using the premises in any manner found objectionable by the UNIVERSITY.
- B. Use of UNIVERSITY food service facilities by third parties is prohibited without the express written consent of the UNIVERSITY.
- C. The premises shall be used for the purpose of food service concessions solely for the benefit of the UNIVERSITY. The use of the premises for purposes other than as specified is prohibited.

### 5.8 <u>CONTRACTOR'S PERSONNEL</u>

CONTRACTOR'S personnel shall comply with established UNIVERSITY policies in regards to Sexual Harassment and Related Conduct, Workplace Non-Violence, and Illegal Drugs and Alcohol Abuse. The UNIVERSITY reserves the right to require the CONTRACTOR to remove personnel from servicing UNIVERSITY accounts. The UNIVERSITY will not tolerate objectionable or inappropriate behavior. ### 5.9 MANAGEMENT TEAM

The UNIVERSITY reserves the right to require a change in the CONTRACTOR'S management team if performance is deemed unsatisfactory. All requests shall be in writing, and shall not be in violation of applicable employment law; and in accordance with CONTRACTOR'S personnel policies.

### 5.10 RISK OF LOSS

Any and all goods, wares, merchandise, furniture, equipment and personal property of any kind or description which may be on the premises at any time during the term of the CONTRACT, regardless of ownership of such property, shall be at the sole risk and hazard of the CONTRACTOR, and the CONTRACTOR shall not hold the UNIVERSITY liable or responsible for any loss thereof or damage thereto caused by water, gas, defective electrical wiring, fire, or by or for any other cause whatsoever unless the same shall be due to any act or omission of the UNIVERSITY, its officers, or employees.

### 5.11 TAXES AND ASSESSMENTS

The CONTRACTOR shall pay at least TEN (10) days before the same becomes delinquent all taxes, rates, assessments, impositions, duties, charges and other outgoings of every description to which the premises or the UNIVERSITY or CONTRACTOR, in respect thereof are now or may during said term become liable based upon any operations of the CONTRACTOR under this CONTRACT, whether the same are or shall be assessed to be payable by law by either the UNIVERSITY or CONTRACTOR.

### 5.12 PREMISES/PROPERTY UPON TERMINATION

Upon termination of the CONTRACT, the CONTRACTOR shall remove non-UNIVERSITY equipment from the premises and restore the premises to as good a condition as at the commencement of the operations, alterations to the premises which have been previously approved by the UNIVERSITY and ordinary wear and tear excepted. CONTRACTOR and UNIVERSITY shall jointly conduct a closing inspection. Surrendered premises shall be left in a clean and order state satisfactory to the UNIVERSITY. To accomplish this, the CONTRACTOR and the UNIVERSITY shall establish a checklist of the work that shall be done to restore the premises in a clean and orderly condition at least ONE (1) month prior to termination.

The CONTRACTOR shall, at its own expense, restore the premises to a condition satisfactory to the UNIVERSITY within THIRTY (30) days after the termination of the CONTRACT. Furthermore, upon the termination of the CONTRACT, should the CONTRACTOR fail to remove any and all personal property, equipment, and/or vehicles from the premises, the UNIVERSITY may, at the UNIVERSITY'S option, (a) remove any and all such personal property, equipment and/or vehicles from the premises and place said property in storage at the cost and expense of CONTRACTOR; or (b) consider all such personal property, equipment and/or vehicles as "abandoned" and remove and dispose of said personal property, equipment and/or vehicles at CONTRACTOR'S cost and expense, and the CONTRACTOR does hereby agree to pay all costs and expenses for removal and disposal of such personal property, equipment and/or vehicles.

### 5.13 TRANSITION UPON TERMINATION

CONTRACTOR agrees to permit prospective offerors for a subsequent contract access to the premises for the purposes of inspecting equipment and facilities during the call for offers period at mutually agreeable times between the CONTRACTOR and the UNIVERSITY. After the new contract is awarded, the current contractor shall permit the new contractor access to the premises at mutually agreeable times between the current contractor and the new contractor for an order phase in of the new contractor. The current contractor shall have the option to sell to the new contractor all its food inventory of merchantable and usable quality at prices no greater than originally paid by the current contractor.

### 5.14 RIGHTS AND REMEDIES OF THE UNIVERSITY FOR DEFAULT

In the event any operations furnished by the CONTRACTOR in the performance of the CONTRACT should fail to conform to the specifications, the UNIVERSITY may reject the same, and it shall thereupon become the duty of the CONTRACTOR to correct same to conform to specifications, without expense to the UNIVERSITY provided that should the CONTRACTOR fail, neglect, or refuse to do so, the UNIVERSITY shall thereupon have the right to provide for such operations, and the CONTRACTOR shall pay the UNIVERSITY the cost incurred in securing such service.

### 5.15 EXAMINATION AND AUDIT

- A. CONTRACTOR shall maintain accurate, complete and separate books of accounts according to generally accepted accounting principles reflecting the food service concession operations at the UNIVERSITY together with appropriate supporting data and documents.
- B. CONTRACTOR shall make said books of accounts and supporting data and documents available in the State of Hawai'i for inspection, reproduction, and audit by the UNIVERSITY, at all reasonable times, and shall retain and make available said books, data, and documents at all reasonable times for a period of at least THREE (3) years after the close of the UNIVERSITY'S fiscal year. If a dispute, discrepancy, litigation, or claim is instituted before the expiration of the THREE (3) periods the CONTRACTOR shall retain all books of account, data, and supporting documents until such disputes, discrepancies, claims, litigations, or audit findings are resolved.
- C. The CONTRACTOR shall submit to the UNIVERSITY operating statements, including but not limited to, sales receipts by stand and category of sales by location within TWENTY (20) days after the close of each calendar month. Causes of abnormal revenue deviations shall be noted by the CONTRACTOR as part of this statement. The format of all reports shall be in a format approved by the UNIVERSITY.
- D. The CONTRACTOR shall conduct an annual sales and rebate audit for the CONTRACT year, in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and by an independent certified public accounting firm at the expense of the CONTRACTOR. The scope of this examination shall be such that an auditor's opinion shall be issued. The CONTRACTOR shall notify the UNIVERSITY, in writing, of any deficiency made known as a result of said audit.
- E. The CONTRACTOR shall, within THIRTY (30) days of receipt of audit report, correct any deficiencies noted by said audit, in its accounting procedures. If the audit should uncover the under reporting of sales, the CONTRACTOR shall make the appropriate payment to the UNIVERSITY. If the result of the audit is an overpayment by the CONTRACTOR to the UNIVERSITY, the UNIVERSITY shall refund or credit the CONTRACTOR for the amount overpaid.

### 5.16 TERM

The successful OFFEROR agrees to enter into a CONTRACT with the UNIVERSITY from the date designated in the Notice to Proceed to June 30, 2034. This FIFTEEN (15) year CONTRACT term shall be renewable for an additional five (5) years upon mutual written agreement by the CONTRACTOR and the UNIVERSITY.

### 5.17 <u>ESCALATION CLAUSE</u>

Prices shall remain fixed from the start of the CONTRACT to June 30, 2020, provided the Federal and Hawai`i State tax structure and the statutory minimum wage requirements remain the same. Pricing for Residential Dining, Retail Dining, and Catering concessions shall be capped at the pricing supplied in this CFO (including **ATTACHMENT F**) for the initial period from the start of the CONTRACT through June 30, 2020. However, this does not preclude

changes in price downward during this period. CONTRACTOR'S request for price changes in subsequent years shall be submitted to the UNIVERSITY for review no later than (90) days prior to July 1st in an agreed upon format by the UNIVERSITY and CONTRACTOR. Overall escalation in prices shall not increase dramatically from year to year. All price increases must also be presented with adequate justification for requested increases to the Chartered Student Organizations (CSO's); which includes the Campus Center Board (CCB), Resident Housing Association (RHA), the Associated Students of the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa (ASUH), and the Graduate Student Organization (GSO).

Request for changes in prices shall be considered by the UNIVERSITY and take into account the following factors:

- A. The Consumer Price Index-All Urban Consumer Report for Honolulu, Hawai`i, for Food away from home, as issued by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics Data, or its equivalent replacement.
- B. Statutory changes in the minimum local labor hourly rates.
- C. Statutory changes in the Federal and State of Hawai'i Tax Structure.

Such price adjustment shall be held firm for a period of TWELVE (12) months. The CONTRACTOR shall submit to the UNIVERSITY monthly and on an agreed upon form, all new menu and product items to be introduced. Subject to the approval of the UNIVERSITY, new products may be sold and prices shall remain fixed for the period through June 30. UNIVERSITY approved prices shall become effective July 1.

### 5.18 <u>INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR</u>

In the performance of the operations required under this Agreement, the CONTRACTOR is an "independent contractor," with the authority and responsibility to control and direct the performance and details of the work and services required under the CONTRACT; however, the UNIVERSITY shall have a general right to inspect work to determine whether, in the UNIVERSITY'S opinion, the services are being performed by the CONTRACTOR in compliance with the CONTRACT. The CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR'S employees and agents are not by reason of this CONTRACT, agents or employees of the UNIVERSITY for any purpose, and the CONTRACTOR and the CONTRACTOR'S employees and agents shall not be entitled to claim or receive for the UNIVERSITY any vacation, sick leave, retirement, worker's compensation, unemployment insurance, or other benefits provided to UNIVERSITY employees. Furthermore, the CONTRACTOR intentionally, voluntarily, and knowingly assumes the sole and entire liability to the CONTRACTOR'S employees and agents in the course of their employment. The CONTRACTOR is responsible for securing all employeerelated insurance coverage for the CONTRACTOR and the CONTRACTOR'S employees and agents that are or may be required by law, and for payment of all premiums, cost, and other liabilities associated with securing the insurance coverage.

### 5.19 USE OF UNIVERSITY'S NAME

The CONTRACT conveys no right to the CONTRACTOR to use the name University of Hawai'i or University of Hawai'i at Mānoa with respect to or in connection with any of its operations, and, upon the termination of this CONTRACT for any reason, the CONTRACTOR shall have

no right to indicate its relationship with the UNIVERSITY with respect to any of its operations except with the written consent of the UNIVERSITY.

### 5.20 JURISDICTION/SERVICE OF PROCESS

The CONTRACTOR, by execution of the CONTRACT, acknowledges that the CONTRACTOR is transacting business within the State of Hawai`i and hereby submits to the jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Hawai`i as to any cause of action arising out of the performance and/or breach of this CONTRACT. The CONTRACTOR further agrees that when absent from the State of Hawai`i, any service of process may be made by leaving a certified copy of a summons on the Director or Deputy Director of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, State of Hawai`i, and mailing be certified or registered mail, postage prepaid, a copy of said summons to CONTRACTOR.

### 5.21 INDEMNIFICATION

CONTRACTOR shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the UNIVERSITY and the State of Hawai`i, and their officers, employees, agents, or any person acting on their behalf from and against: (a) any claim or demand for loss, liability or damage, including, but not limited to, claims for property damage, personal injury or death, by whomsoever brought, arising from any act or omission by the CONTRACTOR, or any of its officers, employees, SUBCONTRACTORS, assignees, or representatives in the performance of the CONTRACT; except liability arising out of the sole negligence of the UNIVERSITY or its officers and employees; (b) all claims, suits and damages by whomsoever brought or made by reason of the nonobservance or nonperformance by the CONTRACTOR, or any of its officers, employees, SUBCONTRACTORS, assignees, or representatives of any of the terms, covenants and conditions herein or the rules, regulations, ordinances and laws of the federal, state, municipal or county governments. Furthermore, the CONTRACTOR shall reimburse the UNIVERSITY and the State of Hawai`i, and their officers, employees, agents, or any person acting on their behalf for all attorney's fees, costs and expenses incurred in connection with the defense of any such claims.

### 5.22 LITIGATION

If, without any fault, the UNIVERSITY, or any of its agents, officers, or employees shall be made a party to any litigation commenced by or against the CONTRACTOR arising out of the CONTRACTOR'S use of the premises, then the CONTRACTOR shall pay all costs and reasonable attorney's fees incurred or imposed upon the UNIVERSITY in connection with the litigation. The CONTRACTOR shall also pay all costs and reasonable attorney's fees incurred or paid by the UNIVERSITY in enforcing the terms and conditions of the CONTRACT. Each party shall give prompt notice to the other of any claim or suit instituted against it that may affect the other party.

### 5.23 INSURANCE

CONTRACTOR shall maintain insurance acceptable to the UNIVERSITY in full force and effect throughout the term of this CONTRACT. The policy or policies of insurance maintained by CONTRACTOR shall provide Combined Single Limit Coverage (bodily injury and property damage) in the amount of \$5,000,000 per occurrence and Damage to Rented Premises coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence.

Insurance shall be in force the first day of the term of this CONTRACT.

Each insurance policy required by this CONTRACT shall contain the following three clauses:

- A. "This insurance shall not be cancelled, limited in scope of coverage or non-renewed until after THIRTY (30) days written notice has been given to the University of Hawai'i, Office of Procurement and Real Property Management."
- B. "It is agreed that any insurance maintained by the University of Hawai`i will apply in excess of, and not contribute with, insurance provided by this policy."
- C. "The University of Hawai`i is added as an insured as respects to operations performed for the University of Hawai`i."

Clauses B and C are waived for any professional liability/errors and omissions liability insurance. CONTRACTOR agrees to deposit with the UNIVERSITY, on or before the effective date of this CONTRACT, certificates of insurance necessary to satisfy the UNIVERSITY that the insurance provisions of this CONTRACT have been complied with and to keep such insurance in effect and the certificates therefore on deposit with the UNIVERSITY during the entire term of this CONTRACT.

The UNIVERSITY shall retain the right at any time to review the coverage, form, and amount of insurance required herein. If, in the opinion of the UNIVERSITY, the insurance provisions in this CONTRACT do not provide adequate protection for the UNIVERSITY, the UNIVERSITY may require CONTRACTOR to obtain insurance sufficient in coverage, form, and amount to provide adequate protection. The UNIVERSITY'S requirements shall be reasonable but shall be designed to assure protection from and against the kind and extent of the risks, which exist at the time a change in insurance is required.

The UNIVERSITY shall notify the CONTRACTOR in writing of changes in the insurance requirements; and if CONTRACTOR does not deposit copies of acceptable insurance policies with the UNIVERSITY incorporating such changes within SIXTY (60) days of receipt of such notice, this CONTRACT shall be in default without further notice to CONTRACTOR and the UNIVERSITY shall be entitled to all legal remedies.

The procuring of such required policy or policies of insurance shall not be construed to limit CONTRACTOR'S liability hereunder nor to fulfill the indemnification provisions and requirements of this CONTRACT. Notwithstanding said policy or policies of insurance, CONTRACTOR shall be obligated for the full and total amount of any damage, injury, or loss arising from its acts or omissions with respect to this CONTRACT.

NOTE: Other forms of insurance coverage naming the UNIVERSITY as additional insured, such as the Owner's and CONTRACTOR'S Protective Liability Insurance Policy, with the above limits shall be acceptable.

### 5.24 <u>TERMINATION OF CONTRACT</u>

In the event the CONTRACTOR fails to meet all commitments in accordance with the CONTRACT specifications and does not remedy such default within THIRTY (30) days after receipt of written notice, the UNIVERSITY reserves the right to terminate the CONTRACT.

Should the UNIVERSITY exercise its right of termination, such exercise shall be without prejudice to any other remedy or right of action, which the UNIVERSITY may have for any preceding or other breach of CONTRACT.

### 5.25 FIDELITY BOND

The CONTRACTOR shall provide a Third-Party Fidelity Bond of a nature designed for food service operations covering all employees of the CONTRACTOR in an amount satisfactory to the UNIVERSITY. The bond shall contain an endorsement indemnifying the UNIVERSITY in the event the dishonesty of a CONTRACTOR'S employee results in a loss of UNIVERSITY property. The CONTRACTOR may also satisfy the requirement of this section through the provision of third-party fidelity coverage and Blanket Crime Insurance, endorsed to cover "Third Party Liability", as part of its corporate insurance for general liability coverage.

### 5.26 LAWS TO BE OBSERVED

The CONTRACTOR shall at all times observe and comply with all federal, state and local laws or ordinances, rules and regulations which in any manner affect those engaged or employed in the operation of the Food Services Concession under this Contract, and the conduct of the operations. The CONTRACTOR shall also comply with all such orders and decrees of bodies or tribunals having any jurisdiction or authority over the operations. Any reference to such laws, ordinances, rules and regulations shall include any amendments thereto.

The CONTRACTOR shall protect and indemnify the UNIVERSITY and all its officers, agents and employees against any claim or liability arising from or based on the violation of any such laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, orders and decrees, whether such violation is committed by the CONTRACTOR and/or any of its officers, employees, agents, subcontractors, assignees, or representatives. If any discrepancy or inconsistency is discovered in this Contract in relation to any such laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, orders or decrees, the CONTRACTOR shall forthwith report the same to the UNIVERSITY.

### 5.27 PATENTED ARTICLE

The CONTRACTOR will be required to, and shall hold the UNIVERSITY and its officers, employees, agents, and any person acting on its behalf harmless against all demands, claims, actions, suits or liabilities arising from the use of any patented article, patented process or patented appliance used in connection with this Contract. Any royalties due or becoming due for the use of any patented article or process shall be paid by the CONTRACTOR.

### 5.28 SUBCONTRACTING AND ASSIGNMENT

The CONTRACTOR shall not subcontract, convey, transfer or assign any of the rights under this Food Services Concession and/or this Contract with the UNIVERSITY, nor shall the CONTRACTOR assign the Contract to any other person or firm without written permission from the

UNIVERSITY, and no subcontract or assignment made without such permission will be recognized. No subcontract shall, under any circumstances, relieve the CONTRACTOR of its obligation and liability under this Contract with the UNIVERSITY, and all persons engaged in performing services covered by the Contract shall be considered employees of the CONTRACTOR.

### 5.29 GOVERNING LAW

The Contract and any of its terms or provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the parties to the Contract, shall be governed by the laws of the State of Hawai'i. Any action at law or in equity to enforce or interpret the provisions of the Contract shall be brought in a state court of competent jurisdiction in Honolulu, Hawaii.

### 5.30 **SEVERABILITY**

In the event that any provision of the Contract is declared invalid or unenforceable by a court, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining terms of the Contract.

### 5.31 WAIVER

The failure of the UNIVERSITY to insist upon the strict compliance with any term, provision or condition of the Contract shall not constitute or be deemed to constitute a waiver or relinquishment of the UNIVERSITY's right to enforce the same in accordance with the Contract.

### 5.32 MODIFICATIONS TO CONTRACT

Subject to mutual written agreement, the parties to the Contract may make modifications within the general scope of this Contract.

### 5.33 NOVATION OR CHANGE OF NAME

- (A) Recognition of a successor in interest; novation. When in the best interest of the UNIVERSITY, a successor in interest may be recognized in a novation agreement in which the transferor and the transferee and the UNIVERSITY shall agree that the transferee assumes all of the transferor's obligations; and the transferor remains liable for all obligations under the Contract but waives all rights under the Contract as against the UNIVERSITY.
- (B) Change of name. When the CONTRACTOR requests to change its name under this Contract, the UNIVERSITY shall, upon receipt of a document indicating such change of name (for example, an amendment to the articles of incorporation of the corporation), enter into an agreement with the CONTRACTOR to effect such a change of name. The agreement changing the name shall specifically indicate that no other terms and conditions of the Contract are thereby changed.

### 5.34 USE OF UNIVERSITY'S NAME

Except as specifically provided herein, the Contract conveys no right to the CONTRACTOR to use the name University of Hawai'i with respect to or in connection with any of its operations under this

Contract, and, upon the termination of this Contract for any reason, the CONTRACTOR shall have no right to indicate its relationship with the UNIVERSITY with respect to any of its operations except with the written consent of the UNIVERSITY.

### 5.35 FURNISHED PROPERTY

The CONTRACTOR assumes complete responsibility for equipment and facilities furnished by the UNIVERSITY in connection with the Contract and the CONTRACTOR agrees to pay for all such equipment and facilities damaged or not accounted for to the UNIVERSITY's satisfaction. The furnishing to CONTRACTOR of any equipment or facilities in connection with this Contract shall not, unless otherwise expressly provided, be construed to vest title thereto in the CONTRACTOR.

  - 4. Meeting foodservice facility health and safety standards.

- 5. Assume residence hall bed spaces are 2,576 (not including staff) and apartments are 1,088 (not including staff).
- 6. Assume on-campus occupancy of 92% for fall and spring semesters; with apartment students on the meal plan at a 25% rate.
- 7. Assume meal plan service dates for the total include: EIGHTEEN (18) weeks for fall, EIGHTEEN (18) weeks for spring, and TWELVE (12) weeks for summer.
- 8. Assume any taxes that may be realized should be included, such as general excise taxes.

- 10. The FY20 Meal Plan price increase proposal for FY20 is a 3% increase. This 3% Meal Plan price increase over the current meal plan pricing in **Attachment A**, should be used for the first projected year of the CONTRACT in the Financial Pro Forma. Thereafter, the OFFEROR shall not propose more than a 5% increase annually and make every effort to keep prices low and affordable for students. Retail pricing, especially for branded concepts, should not be priced above the off-campus pricing of the same or similar retail items.
- 11. Any renovation capital offered for building renovations and new concept equipment and furnishings should be itemized with the pro forma based on anticipated project implementation year.
- 12. OFFEROR shall review the current Mānoa Dining Services Equipment Replacement Schedule (**Attachment E**) and assess what the OFFEROR determines those costs should be for the CONTRACT Term. All anticipated expenses related to the repair and replacement of foodservice equipment shall be included in the financial *pro forma*.
- 13. Appendix D 3 through D 7 are to be completed by the OFFEROR in order to provide financial projections for the first FIFTEEN (15) year CONTRACT Term given the assumptions being provided. Year ONE (1) sales data is provided based on FY18 performance and FY20 anticipated meal plan sales based on the expected meal plan participation provided. The meal plans follow the "all you care to eat" service style at the resident dining locations of Gateway and Hale Aloha Cafés, and have the flexibility to use meal equivalency swipes at retail dining locations.

The meal plans have a specified number of meals each week which reset every Saturday night at midnight, with the exception of Apartment Club which allows a set amount of meals per semester. Unused meals will expire when the meal plans reset. Meal Plan Points expire at the end of the academic year after spring. Dining Dollars and Bonus Dining Dollars do not expire until TWO (2) years of account inactivity.

When using meal swipes at retail dining locations like Campus Center Food Court or Ba-Le, each meal swipe currently has a meal equivalency value of \$5.50. Refunds and credits cannot be given for purchases under \$5.50. However, meal plan holders can use a combination of meal swipes and other accepted payment methods to complete their purchases.
