

Request for Traffic Safety Grant Applications Federal Fiscal Year 2021

The Hawaii Department of Transportation (HDOT) is accepting grant applications from local county and state government agencies and non-profit organizations (e.g., Safe Community Coalitions; police departments; traffic safety advocates) interested in applying for Federal traffic safety grants funded by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. The grants must align with a strategy within the Hawaii Strategic Highway Safety Plan (<https://hidot.hawaii.gov/highways/shsp/>) and focus on changing driving behaviors, such as speeding and impaired driving. There will be approximately \$1 million in Federal funds available for traffic safety projects.

Applications for Federal Fiscal Year 2021 must be submitted/postmarked no later than 4:30 p.m. on Friday, February 14, 2020. Applications may be e-mailed to a Highway Safety Specialist listed below or mailed to:
